And after the legacies heretofore mentioned are my just debts and the expenses of settling of my estate are paid off and satisfied my will is and I do so give and bequeath to the said David McLeod of Cumberland County the sum of thirty five dollars

And I do so give and bequeath and decure unto John Williamson of Montgomery County Seventh Methodist Christian. Matthew of Merri County & W. J. Bassin and daughter to Barrin of Cabarrus County the sum of my estate both real and personal and every part and parcel thereof forever

And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend John Williamson Seventh Methodist my lawful executor to all intents and purposes to execute this my last will and testament according to the true intent and meaning of the said my last will and every part and clause thereof hereby reciting and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made
