

41 Daniel Monroe's will

In the name of God Amen:

I Daniel Monroe of the County of Montgomery
and State of North Carolina in my common good sense and
sound memory thanks be to Almighty God for the same doth
on the twenty-ninth day of July in the year of Our Lord one
thousand eight hundred and forty four doth make and
perlish this my last will and testament in and manner
following that is to say

1st I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Isabella
Monroe this my tract of land wherein I now lie including
all my other tracts of land which are adjoining the same
her lifetime except fifty acres which lies on the south
side of Silver run - My will furthermore is that
my said wife shall have the following negroes her life-
time to wit Sely, Sim, Nima, Susie, Viola & Mary
together with all my stock of cattle of every description
& except what I shall mention in another place in this my
last will. I also desire that my wife as aforesaid shall
in her lifetime have all my farming utensils of every
description and also all my household and kitchen
furniture together with my wagon, horses and
blacksmith's tools.

My will also is that my
wife above mentioned shall have the following negroes
entire to dispose of them as she in her wisdom may
think proper to wit Iulet her children and her
issue, Barbara and Kelly & their issue, if any also
Ganey & George -

2nd I give and bequeath unto my daughter Margaret
M'Lenon my negro girl named Minney her
children and her issue also my negro named
Seyton, and Rhoda the issue of any

3rd I give and bequeath to my daughter Isabella M'Nae
my negro woman named Benoy her children and
her issue also my negro boy named Frank

4th I give and bequeath to my son Duncan Monroe
my negro woman named Shebe her children and
her issue also my negro named Zoney & Will
except my desire is that my wife aforesaid shall

have and possess the above-mentioned Shebe and her children
during the lifetime of my sd wife and after her decease
my will is that my son Duncan Monroe shall own
and possess the aforesaid Shebe her children and her
issue - also my negro man named Sim my will also
is that after the death of my wife aforesaid that my
son Duncan Monroe shall have my Threshing machine
blacksmith shop - Wagon and still together with my
black-horse - two cows and one feather bed and
furniture -

5th I give and bequeath unto the heirs of my son John
Monroe dec'd my negro named Hannah, Easter, Selly
Milly and Ben my will is that there shall be no
division made of those last mentioned negroes amongst
the heirs until the youngest son shall arrive at the age
of Twenty one years of age at which time the last men-
tioned negroes shall be equally divided amongst the
heirs of John Monroe & share and share my will
furthermore is that John Monroe younger heir of
John Monroe & shall have my tract of land on
the south side of Silver Run adjoining James Williams
& others containing fifty acres
