This Cause coming on to be heard on the 26th day of October 1882 is continued to the 13th day of November 1882 upon motion of Allen Jordan Esq Counsel for Applicants and being heard upon Affidavit made by John Harris & Samuel Green the heirs at law next of kin & all other persons interested having been duly notified according to the order of Court to appear & show Cause if any they have against the said will and it appearing by the testimony in Court of Samuel Green & John Harris both of Montgomery County that the said

Peter Green Will -

Peter Green at his residence in said County on the 29th day of August A.D. 1882 in their presence and hearing and in his last sickness did declare & pronounce the following words to wit: "I want to have long it appear like: I want my youngest children to have every thing I possess - I don't want his oldest children to have things he had meaning they understood the three last children by name as follows Minerva Moley & General

That the said decedent was of sound mind & that by these words as declared & pronounced the said Peter Green intended to make a testamentary disposition of the personal & real estate as devised in the will & so intended to be conveyed. It is therefore decreed that said testamentary words be approved & allowed as the municipal will of said decedent. Done 13th Nov. 1882
