

98. Garrott Parker's Will

By the Justices of Montgomery County Court July Term 1829 - It Being Certified to us that Garrott Parker Esq; of Said County is dead and hath made a will in writing a copy of which is herewith annexed in which will he hath appointed Mary Parker John O'Gier and Lewis Parker Executors of said will who exhibited and proved said will and qualified according to law.

These are therefore to instruct the said Mary Parker and Lewis Parker to enter upon all and singular the goods and chattels lights and credits of the said Garrott Parker and the same into their possession to whatsoever in this State to be found and an inventory thereof to return into the Court record according to law and all the just debts of the deceased and distribution make &c.

In the name of god amen I Garrott Parker Esq; of the State of North Carolina and County of Montgomery Being of sound and perfect mind blessed be the Almighty God, do this the 14th day of February in the year of our Lord 1829 - Do make and publish this my last and testament in manner and form following that is to say first I give and bequeath to my living wife Mary Parker all my property to lease my children upon except the land that I give my son Lewis Parker and Garrott Parker I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Parker fifty acres of land on the water of Clark's Creek - I also give and bequeath to my son Garrott where he now lives until his death his life time or while she remains a widow in case my wife Mary Parker shall be intitled to child ~~she~~ only it is further my will that the residue of land equally divided between my sons Mason Parker -

William Parker and Callahan Parker at my wife's death or marriage

It is further my will that my other property be divided in the following manner that is to say at my wife's death or marriage for John Parker and my daughter Martha Parker to have five dollars

It is further my will that John M. Roe and daughter Mary M. Roe to have one dollar each

I likewise give and bequeath to my youngest daughter Sarah a negro girl named Eliza

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Mary O'Gier fifteen dollars

I also give and bequeath to my daughter Eliza Parker Margaret and Emily Parker each fifty dollars the residue of my property is to be equally divided among all my children except Martha Parker and since after Martha Parker will get nothing except the five dollars above mentioned my other children will receive an equal share with one of children that is they all together will receive a child's part of the residue of my property

I hereby make John O'Gier Jr. and Lewis Parker Executors of this my last will and testament in witness whereof I the said Garrott Parker do have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the day & date and year above written
