Item. I will and devise and bequeath all of my personal estate on and after the death of my beloved wife Susan Nichols to Jonathan Tucker, Noah Tucker, Gilbert Tucker and Martha Tucker children of poor Tucker.

I declare the above to be my last will and testament and devise. I do witness whereof I Gilbert R Nichols have hereunto set my hand and seal this the 16th day of March 1897 signed sealed published and declared by the above named Gilbert R Nichols as and for his last will and testament in the presence of us who at his request and in his presence have described our names as witnesses thereto.

(1) I give unto my wife Mary Lomax all my land and property with exception of one piece of land adjoining the lands of W P Turner, C H Chandler & W Davis, which she is to hold and to have the benefit of her lifetime.

(2) I give and bequeath unto my son Haven Lomax this piece of land just excepted adjoining the lands of W Turner, C H Chandler and W Davis as just stated above.
