 excepted and to be equally divided between
 I Cornilison and P. W. Cornilison Wiley M.
 Dalberry and Ellen F. Russell as they may
 see proper to the amount I also give my
 daughter Wiley M. Dalberry and her heirs
 my horses, wagon, buggy, all my farm
 implements, all my household and kitchen
 furniture, all my cattle and hogs, three
 of each in number and all my corn & wheat
 provided nevertheless that Wiley M. Dalberry
 shall not allow Jason Dalberry to remain
 remain upon the above mentioned
 lands or have any thing to do with
 any of the above mentioned property
 in any way whatever. A willful violation
 of the above provision will make this will
 of no effect and the land shall be equally
 divided between the above named heirs
 B. W. Cornilison to have all the money
 he has of mine
 2^d I give unto my sons B. Cornilison and
 P. W. Cornilison and my daughter Ellen
 F. Russell 50 acres of land more or less
 known as the pine woods tract to be equally
 divided as they see proper
 3^d I give unto B. G. Bean, Denny Bean,
 Jennie Bean, A. W. Bean, Polly Bean and
 C. R. Bean, 100 one dollar each in money
 The above written in consideration of this
 frail and transitory life
 In witness whereof I the said Goodman
 Cornilison have to this my last will and
 Testament set my hand and seal
