Last will and Testament of John C. Garrison
At my death after all my just debts shall
have been paid, I desire that my remaining
property be disposed of in the following manner
First, it is my will that my interest in the tract
of land on which my Dep. Mother now lives called
the Oliver place shall belong to my Father's children
by his second marriage -

The gold watch formerly the property of my Father
I wish to be given to my sister, Ellen Weston.

The Negro Woman Lucy her two children and her
increase my interest in the mill tract of land
whatever money may be coming to me from my
Father's estate or that may then be on hand and

any other property that may then belong to me
not specified above I wish and bequeath to

my brother E. F. Garrison.

Court and the same reading of John C. Montgomery

Amosborne, William's will

I Amosborne Williams of the County of Montgomery and
State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory
do make and declare this my last will and testament
in manner and form following to wit: First that my
executors hereinafter named shall provide for my body a
decent burial suitable to the wishes of my Relations and
friends and pay all funeral expenses together with all my
just debts out of the monies that may first come into
their hands or in part or parcel of the estate.

Second I give and devise to my son Wilson S. Williams
all of that tract of land known as the Hunter Place
containing Eighteen acres adjoining the lands of William Water
John M. Mack and others to have and to hold to him his
heirs and assigns in fee simple for ever.

Third I give and devise to my son Thomas S. Williams
all the land on which I now live known as the home place containing
one hundred and fifty six acres adjoining the lands of E. F. Garrison
Elizabeth Sedberry and others to have and to hold to him his
heirs and assigns forever - My will and desire is
that the above said Thomas S. Williams shall maintain and
support his three sisters to wit Eliza Maria Martha S. and Jane S.
Williams as long as they are unmarried or as long as they
demand to remain to be supported by the said property.

Then third - My will and desire is that my son James S. Williams
and others shall remain on the above named premises and the
proceeds of the sale of so much thereof as will be necessary to
the maintenance of my three daughters Eliza Maria S. and Jane S.

B. Williams as long as any two of the above named daughters shall re-
main to remain on the premises, when any two of my daughters have
the business of their own free will and desire then and in that case
my executors shall proceed to sell the above named premises and convey
if any to the highest bidder and the proceeds to be equally divided
between and share alike amongst all my children Wilson S. Williams
Thomas S. Williams Eliza Maria Williams Martha S. Williams Jane S.
B. Williams and my deceased daughter Nancy Dearbough six
children the heirs of her body to have one share equally with
my other sons and daughters being I name the said Martha S. Deborah M.
Frances S. and Elizabeth S. Dearbough -

Fourth I give and bequeath to my son Thomas S. Williams
