have thought proper to make such distribution of the
same as to me seems proper and right and first of
all I commend my soul to the Lord God who can do
all and desire that my body be decently and properly
buried and all of my just debts if there be any
unpaid at the time of my decease and it is my
desire and will that my beloved wife Elizabeth
Hunsucker have all of my personal and real property
during her life time and after her death equally divided
among my children if any left except one tract of
land adjoining E. H. Hunsucker and A. S. Hunsucker
containing about five acres more or less I give to both
Hunsucker after the death of my wife and bequeath
this my last Will and Testament
