In the name of God Amen

I Kenneth Leman of the County of Montgomery and State of North Carolina do make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner and form following first I give to my wife Sarah Leman the land on which I now live with all its Appurtenances and and all my house hold and Kitchen furniture waggon and Smith Tools during his natural life also the Negroes Sep Bet Rachel Joe Ned and Est also all my stock of Horses and Cattle of every kind description except one horse which is now claimed by my son Martin so my daughter Ann Martin I give the boy Sam so my son Alexander M Leman I give the boy Sam so my son Martin M Leman I give the boy Jacob so daughter Flora M Leman I give the boy Bob and one bed with its furniture

so my sister Effy M Leman I leave the some of fifty Dollars which is to be paid to her in equal portions by my heirs (boys) Alexander M Leman Martin M Leman Elford M Leman and Ann Martin - after my wife death I wish my son Martin M Leman to have and keep possession of all my lands the waggon and ship tools the rest of the remaining Negroes and property I wish equally divided among all my heirs -

William Green's Will

In the name of God Amen

I William Green of the County of Montgomery and State of North Carolina being advanced in years and suffering under considerable bodily infirmity but of a sound mind and disposing mind and memory and considering life uncertain do make and publish this as my last will and Testament hereby Repealing and making void all Wills heretofore made and executed by me First It is my Will and desire and I hereby bequeath to my beloved wife Rebecca Green the tract of Land on which I now live to be hers during her lifetime or widowhood and I further give to my said wife Rebecca Green the use and full enjoyment of all my personal property of every kind and description during her lifetime or widowhood

Second - I give hereby give and bequeath to my son Jackson Green the balance of my home tract of tract of Land after taking off the part of said tract hereinafter given to William Riley Perkins which said balance is one Hundred acres more or less on the south side of Benson Creek to have and to hold to him the said Jackson Green his heirs and assigns forever subject to the lifetime estate of my said wife Rebecca Green her mother or hereinafter specified

Third) I give and bequeath to my grand son William Riley Perkins now living with me on condition that he remains with me and assists in taking of my self and his grand mother my wife Rebecca Green until our demise or until he is twenty one year
