with his line East 68 poles to his other corner line South
68 poles to W. B. Simmons corner on a short line pine with
two post oak pointers. With his line East 112 poles to his
corner from with two pines pointers. With his other line
South 58 poles to a post oak by a small stream and near
the foot of Hick Branch, and having 2 black gum & 1
short gum pointer with his other line East 168 poles
proceed said Hick Branch to the beginning containing
58 1/2 acres more or less.

Item 5. I give devise and bequeath to my grand son
James Henry Simmons one all that portion of my land
known as the Ross Lane lying on the east side of Ross
River opposite W. Ross Mills in the County of Montgomery
and State of Maryland as follows. Beginning at
J. M. Matthews corner back at the mouth of a small
creek on the east bank of Little River and then with
his line S 51° E 120 poles to his corner with his
other line S 55° W 130 poles to his other corner. S 55° E
142 poles to James Rogers line with said line North
68 poles to his other corner with his other line S 35°
E 100 poles to his corner on Ross River line of his John
Donahoe & or near survey with said line S 52° E 158
poles to his Benjamin & Boyd corner of his 40 acre survey
with a line of said survey, recrossed S 45° E 30 poles
to his corner with his other line recrossed S 41° E 118 poles
to his other corner. With his other line recrossed S 56°
W 80 poles to his other corner. With James J. Donahoe and
W. Sanders being in a northward direction to the south
East corner of the same. Then S 20° E 100 poles to the
said survey, west 90 poles to the south west corner of said
survey with a corner of its line North 90 poles to south
East corner. West to Little River then down the river
corner of said River to the beginning containing
a section of Mary Meers Ross Lane 450 acres
more or less.

Item 6. I give devise and bequeath to the Trustees of
W. B. Smith College for the use and benefit of said
College, my certificates of Scholarship in the College of said
but I do reserve & keep and with hold from this bequest
a right in favor of my two grandsons Thomas Jackson
Simmons and James Henry Simmons to represent

said certificates of Scholarship and thereby to receive
free tuition in said College so long as they may be
students thereof and no longer.

I further give devise and bequeath to the said Trustees of
the College of said the following lands in four distinct tracts
all lying in the County of Montgomery and State of Maryland
and containing in the aggregate 238 acres more or less and
bounded as follows.

Tract No 1 Begins at a pine in James Green line and
runs East 56 poles to a post oak in Benjamin Morris line
with said line South 100 poles to a post oak. West 191
poles to said James Green line of his 100 acre survey with
said line direct to the beginning containing 100 acres
granted to Benjamin Morris May 1st 1818 and lying on
the waters of Little Creek. Tract No 2 Begins at George
Jacksons corner South 100 poles with eight pine
pointers and runs with said George Morris line S 51°
E 214 poles to his corner Oak in a glade and having two
hickories and two black oaks pointers. With his other line
North 68 poles to Nicholas Seacks corner post oak by a large
hickory pointers. With his line East 50 poles to a short
hickory corner with his line South 50 W 190 poles to his
large pine corner with his other S 20° E 137 poles to David
Smiths corner post oak having three pine pointers. With his
line S 76 West 106 poles to the beginning containing 60
acres granted to W. B. Simmons December 10th 1856
and lying on the waters of Little Creek.
Tract No 3 Beginning at a short north short line
road and having four pine pointers and about two rods
east from Hick Branch line runs S 11° E 115 poles
to Mrs W. Hays corner pine and three pine pointers
with her line S 45° E 80 poles to her corner pine with
two pine pointers. With James Harshbarts line S 19°
W 100 poles to a post oak by the Fayetteville Road near
Mennerss Run. Then along said Road in a westward
direction following its watercourse corner to the beginning
containing 50 acres known as the Edwards Weigars place
and lying on the waters of Cedar Creek.
Tract No 4 Begins at Hoston Miners corner & goes
standing at the old black Oak corner near Little River
and having an ash pine white oak and two pines
pointers and runs with his line S 30° E 100 poles to
E. H. Wright corner with his line S 6° W 81 poles to

a Stake in Loppis and Hagerwood line With said line West 1/2 pole to rocky Simmons corner of his 100 acre survey With a line of said survey, at 40 we will pole to the beginning Containing 28 acres granted to Rocky Simmons July 7th 1857 and lying in the waters of Cedar Creek

Item 7 I give devise and bequeath to my son William Gaston Spinnans my Salamander safe my large Walnut desk book Case now at my former residence in Montgomery and also of course I also give devise and bequeath to my said son William Gaston Spinnans my ten shares of Stock in the Fayetteville National Bank in Fayetteville together with all sums of money due now from the people National Bank in Fayetteville or which may be due me from said Bank at the time of my decease I likewise give devise and bequeath to my said son William Gaston Spinnans one promissory note on Aaron Wright and J. D. Wright for five hundred dollars on which there are several credits also various other notes on different persons together with the entire residue of my estate of what nature and kind soever After paying all my just debts my burial and funeral charges and the same bequeath here in before made I give devise and bequeath to my said son William Gaston Spinnans his heirs and assigns forever the whole of my property of every description

And last of all I appoint my esteemed son
William G. Simmons and my trust worthy friend
James T. Munjoy to execute this my last Will and
Testaments hereby revoking all former Wills by me made
in writing whereof I the said Ledy, Simmons do herewith
set my hand and seal the eleventh day of December in
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and
seventy four
