J. Miranda A. Rich of the aforesaid County and State, being of sound mind but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence, do make and declare this my last will and testament.

First: My executor, herein after named, shall give my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my friends and relatives, and pay all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts, out of the first money which my come into his hands belonging to my estate.

Second: I give and devise to my nephew and niece Cleo and Henry, daughter and son of Q. E. Rich five dollars in money to each one, to be paid by those to whom I bequeath the balance of my property if there is not enough money on hand.

Third: I give and devise jointly the balance of personal, land and all other property including a twenty dollar note on John Ritter to my nieces, Ruth Usher, Elizabeth Usher and Naomi Usher, consisting of the following lands to wit: The lot of land at Star on which I now live and all the buildings and appurtenances thereto. Also a tract of land in Randolph County, N.C. and bounded as follows, beginning at a stone runs N. 14 chains 50 links to a stone. Thence South 33 chains and 59 links

to a stone. Thence East 15 chains and 85 links to a stone N.E. corner of Panther Creek church. Thence South 4 chains and 80 links to a stone. Thence South 64 chains and 7 links to a stake in the original line. Thence East 5 chains and 96 links to a stone on stake. Thence N. 84° E 10 chains + 55 links to a stone pile. Thence E. 6° chains + 24 links to a stone corner. Thence N. 60° E 25 chains + 25 links to a pine. Thence N. 82 chains + 14 links to a post-oak. Thence N. 88° West 18 chains and 11 links to a white oak bush. Thence N. 60° E 31 + 13 links to the beginning containing 10³ acres more or less. Also a tract of fifty acres in Randolph County N.C. Bounded as follows, beginning on a post-oak in Able Cot's line and runs North 27 chains + 87 links to a hickory Cot's corner. Thence West 17 chains + 66 links to a stone pile Cot's corner. Thence South on same corner line 27 chains + 87 links to small white oak in the old line. Thence E. on said line 17 chains + 66 links to the beginning.

Also a ten acre tract in Randolph County N.C. made to John N. Rich by W. F. Craven & wife Elizabeth M. Craven. I hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friend Dr. J. B. Shambarger my lawful executor to all intents and

purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and claim thereof, hereby revoking and declining utterly void all other wills and testaments by me before made.
