for said purpose I hereby declare him my apprentice.
Both of said apprenticeships to take effect at my
death.

J. Rush the Testatrix of the said Will in the
presence of her affiant & their affiants
hereby signed the said Will & Codicil
exhibited as aforesaid & declared to said Eliza
her last Will & Codicil in the presence of the
same said subscribers witnesses & that the said
Maria Christian & John G. Christian subscriber
their names thereto as witnesses in the presence
of this affiant, & for that this affidavit
says not.
