extra known as the middle field

Calvin McCullum my youngest son to have
one third including the premises where
he now lives to be divided by them after
3rd It is my will that if either of my sons
die before my wife Mary McCullum
and have no heirs that his part go to
the surviving two & if two die the one
that is living their part

4th It is my will that my daughter
Eliza McCullum single woman have one
bed & furniture out spinning wheel & case
one side saddle & Bridle out Cow & calf and
that she be supported all my lands during
her single lifetime

5th It is my will that my daughter Sophia
wife of Martin Powers have her allay
in money out of my estate to go to her
use or the heirs of her body

6th It is my will that my daughter Elizabeth
wife of David Farbough have ten dollars
in money out of my estate to go to her
use or the heirs of her body

7th It is my will that my son Bill
McCullum have one bed & furniture one cow
& calf the residue of my estate at my death
at my death and the death of my wife
Mary McCullum if any belong to whichever
of my sons that takes care of my wife
during her lifetime

8th & last

I do hereby constitute and appoint
my two sons Edward McCullum & Bill
McCullum my lawful Executrix to all intents
& purposes to execute this my last will and
testament according to the true intent and
meaning of the same in witness whereof I the
said Malcolm McCullum do sign at my
hand and seal this the 23rd day of October

Harris Rains Will

I Harris Rains of the county of Montgomery
 & state of North Carolina, being of sound
 mind and memory but considering the
 uncertainty of my earthly existence do make
 and declare this my last Will and Testament
 in manner and form following that is to
 say i first:—That my executors (hereinafter
 named) shall provide for body a decent
 burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives
 and friends and pay all funeral expenses
 together with my just debts however & to
 whom soever owing, out of the money that
 may first come into his hands as a part
 or parcel of my estate.

I then— I give and devise to my son J. E.
 Rains and David J. H. Rains all that tract
 of Land lying on the east side of Beaver Dam
 known as the Elliott lands joining the land
 of Addisons Stokes and others containing
 two hundred and fifty acres to have and
 to hold to them and their heirs in fee
 simple forever— Provided that Thos Daniel
 and W. Peacock to whom it is now bonded
 to not pay for it in five years and take
 it snese they (the said Daniel & Peacock)
 to pay for it. Then the said J. E. Rains
 and the said David J. H. Rains are each
 to receive the sum of five hundred dollars

in Lawful money to be paid to them by my
 Executor out of the proceeds of said Bonded
 Land

I then & give and devise to my youngest
 son Donald J. H. Rains the sum of one
 hundred dollars to be paid by Executor to the
 Guardian of the said J. H. Rains and keep
 an interest by him until the said J. H. Rains
 arrives at the age of twenty one years and
 then the said guardian will pay the amount
 of said sum to the said Donald J. H. Rains.
 I then & give to my beloved wife one
 Bureau

I then My will and devise is that all the
 residue of my estate both real and personal
 after paying out the curvise and legacies above
 mentioned shall be sold by my Execut. & and
 the debts owing to me collected and the
 surplus over and above the payment of debts
 expenses and legacies shall be equally
 divided and paid over to my wife Elizabeth
 and all my children in equal proportion
 share and share alike to them and each
 and every one of them, their executors
 administrators and assigns forever—

And lastly I do hereby constitute and
 appoint my sons J. H. Rains & D. J. H. Rains

I Allen 16th Bean of the County of Montgomery
and State of North Carolina do make and
declare this my last will and testament in
manner and form following that is to say:
I give unto my wife Elizabeth Bean my land
lying in the Valley of Sauratown Creek containing
one hundred acres beginning at a cherry tree
a large white oak pointer in Randolph County
line and running thence south 45° bearing thence
East 22 chains and 60 links thence North
45° bearing thence west 22 chains and
fifty links to the beginning of another
tract containing one hundred acres bounded
as follows beginning in a small Hickory
tree where his old line intersects the Randolph
County line two post oak pointers and
runs down two hundred poles with and
beyond his line to a wild crab tree in an
old field south 86° west 82 poles to a stake
between three Red oaks North 200 poles
to Summer Beans corner line with said
line North 86° East 83 poles to the beginning
of another tract of land containing
sixty six acres beginning at a post oak

in his old line and in the County line and
running with said County line East 80 poles
to John Lucas corner stake with his line
South 200 poles to a stake then west 35 poles
to said stumps corner of his new survey with
said line both 80 poles to his of his old tract
with said line & said survey East 80 poles
to corner said pole with his other line

Delina McBean and lastly I do hereby

lawful executors to all interests & purposes
