 that she be supported all my lands during
 her single lifetime

5th It is my Will that my daughter & phineas
 wife of Martin Parsons have ten dollars
 in money out of my estate to go to her
 use or the hiring of her body

6th It is my Will that my daughter Elizabeth
 wife of David Garbrough have ten dollars
 in money out of my estate to go to her
 use or the hiring of her body

7th It is my Will that my son & wife
 McCallum have one bed & furniture one cow
 & calf the residue of my estate at my death
 at my death and the death of my wife

Mary McCallum & any & every to which one
 of my sons that taking care of me & my wife
 during my lifetime

8th & last I do hereby constitute and appoint
 my two sons Edward McCallum & John
 McCallum my lawful Executors to all intents
 & purposing to execute this my last Will and
 Testament according to the true intent and

Harris Ruvig Will!!

I Harris Ruvig of the county of Montgomery & State of North Carolina, being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say: First:—That my executors (herein after named) shall provide for body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relatives and friends and pay all funeral expenses together with my just debts howsoever & to whomsoever owing, out of the monies that may first come into his hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Item = I give and devise to my son F. E. Ruvig and David J. H. Ruvig all that tract of Land lying on the east side of Beaver Dam known as the Elliot lands joining the lands of Saderton & Stokes and others & containing two hundred and fifty acres to have and to hold to them and their heirs in fee simple forever—Provided that they Daniel and W. Prosser to whom it is now bonded do not pay for it in five years and take to encase they (the said Daniel & Prosser) do pay for it. Then the said F. E. Ruvig and the said David J. H. Ruvig are to receive the sum of five hundred dollars

in lawful ^{money} to be paid to them by my Executor out of the proceeds of said bonded Land.

Item = I give and devise to my youngest son David J. H. Ruvig the sum of one hundred dollars to be paid by Executors to the Guardians of the said David J. H. Ruvig and kept an interest by him until the said David J. H. Ruvig arrives at the age of twenty one years and then this said guardian will pay the amount of said sum to the said David J. H. Ruvig.

Item = I give to my beloved wife our Bearer.

Item My Will and desire is that all the residue of my estate both real and personal after paying out the debts and legacies above mentioned shall be sold by my Executors and the debts owing to me collected and the surplus over and above the payment of debts expenses and legacies shall be equally divided and paid over to my wife Elizabeth and all my children in equal proportion share and share alike to them and each and every one of them, their executors administrators and assigns forever—And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my sons J. H. Ruvig & D. H. Ruvig my lawful executors to all intents and purposes, to execute this my last will and testament, according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof—hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and testaments by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I the said Harris Ruvig do hereunto set my hand and seal this 18th day of April A.D. 1866 Harris Ruvig Sign'd, seal'd, published and declared by the said Harris Ruvig to be his last will and

Allen H. Bean's Will

I Allen H. Bean of the County of Montgomery
and State of North Carolina do make and
declare this my last will and testament in
manner and form following that is to say:

I give unto my wife Elizabeth Bean my land
lying in the State of North Carolina containing
one hundred acres beginning at a cherry tree
a large white oak pointer in Randolph County
and running thence South 45 chains thence
East 22 chains and 50 links thence North
45 chains thence West 22 chains and
fifty links to the beginning is to another
tract containing one hundred acres bounded

as follows beginning in a small Hickory
where his old line intersects the Randolph
County line two post oak pointers and
runs down two hundred poles North and
beyond his line to a wild crab tree in an
old field South 86 West 82 poles to a stake
between them 200 poles North 200 poles

to Sumner Beans corner line with said
line North 86 East 83 poles to the beginning
a 20. another tract of land containing
sixty six acres beginning at a post oak

in his old line and in the county line and
running with said county line East 45 poles
to John Lucas corner road with his line
