of Wilson Elliott of the County of
Montgomery and State of North Carolina
being of sound mind and memory
but considering the uncertainty of my
earthly existence do make and declare this
my last will and testament in manner and
form following that is to say first that my
executor hereinafter named shall provide
for my body a decent burial & the wishes
of my relations and friends and pay all
funeral expenses together with my just debts
however and to whomsoever owing out of
the money that may first come into his
hands as a part and parcel of my estate
then I give and devise to my daughter
Martha C. Elliott one bed and furniture
then I give and devise to my beloved
wife Palince Elliott all of my personal
and real estate during the term
of her natural life at the death of my wife
Palince Elliott I give and bequeath to my
grandson J. A. Elliott the sum of twenty
five dollars to be paid by executor out of
the money belonging to my estate & give
and bequeath to my grandson George
J. A. Elliott the sum of twenty five dollars
to be paid by my executor out of the money
that belongs to my estate and the balance of my
real and personal estate to be sold and by
my executor equally divided between my two
daughters Christine Lavelle and Martha C.
Elliott and lastly I do hereby, cause, duly
and appoint my trusty friend J. W. Burns
my lawful Executor to all intents and
purposes to execute this my last will
and testament according to the true
intent and meaning of the same and every
part and clause thereof surely working

and declaring utterly void all other wills
and testaments by me theretofore made
In witness whereof I the said Wilson
Elliott do hereunto set my hand and
seal this 24th day of September 1867

into open court and duly admitted to probate
upon the oath of E. S. Clegg & J. W. Elliott two
subscribing witnesses thereto whereupon it is
ordered to be recorded in court that the said
last will and testament be admitted to
probate and the executor therein named
J. W. Burns is permitted to qualify upon taking
the usual oaths and ordered that letters
testamentary issue - Palince Elliott widow
of Wilson Elliott deceased comes into
open court & in her proper person takes her
dissent to said last will and testament
and it appearing that the said Palince
Elliott is more than twenty one years old
of age her said application is granted

tract of land which I now have or which I
also leave a debt to be handed over to him
at my death which will more fully show I
also give and devise unto the said Jessie Hudson
all my notes or bonds that I have on hand at my
death and also all the money I have on hand at
my death I also give and devise unto the said
Jessie Hudson all other property that I have at my
death and lastly I do hereby nominate and appoint
my trusty friend John Brown my lawful executor
to all intents and purposes to execute this my last
will and testament according to the true intent
and meaning of the same and every part and clause
thereof hereby reciting and declaring attorney and
all other wills and testaments by me theretofore made
in witness whereof I the said William Hudson do subscribe
my hand and seal this December 30th A.D. 1859
