of this frail and transitory life do therefore
make, ordain and declare this to be my last will
and testament that is to say first after all my
lawful debts are paid and discharged the residue
of my estate real and personal I give bequeath and
dispossession as follows to wit:

To my beloved wife the land and appurtenances
situation thereon known and described as the ~~Montgomery~~
~~Summers~~ house tract also another tract during
the same deeded from Alexander Jordan to me in
the County of Montgomery and state of North
Carolina so soon belonging to me during his natural
life and after his death to belong to my daughter
Martha. To my son Archibald the sum
situated lying on Sugg Creek, known as the John
Brown land to have and to hold after the
death of my beloved wife, the stock of all manner
to belong to my beloved wife after her death to
be equally divided among my heirs then living
the property to belong to my beloved wife after her
death to be equally divided among my heirs then
living giving Edmund his choice of three for
Master, I give and devise all the rest of my
residue and remainder of my real and personal
estate to my children now living or to my children
in their heirs that may be living at the time of my
decease, to be equally divided between them share
and share alike.

I likewise make constable and appoint to said
son Archibald and William Cagle to be executors
of this my last will and testament hereby revoking
all my former by me made, in writing, whereof I have been
my remains subscribed to, name and affix my seal
the 18th day of March in the year of our Lord
