William Hall's will

In the name of God Amen I
William Hall of the County of Montgomery State
of North Carolina being weak of body, but of sound
mind, memory and understanding and calling unto
mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty
of death, do this day Ordain, publish and declare
the following to be my last will and Testament
First of all my will and prayer are that my soul
shall return to God who is the Author of the same
and that after death I shall be entered in a
Christian-like manner and my funeral expenses paid
2^d I will that all my last debts shall be paid off
by a sale of a portion of my property first selling
threefourths of the two great mills and all of the
saw-mill, the other fourth of the great mills be-
long to Enock Davis by his keeping up one half
of the expenses of the said mills and one fourth
of the expenses or work in the said mill dams
3^d The balance after paying my last debts I will
and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth to
have and to hold forever and dispose of as
she may deem proper.

In Order that the above will and Testament of
mine shall be fully carried out I Ordain con-
stitute and appoint my worthy friend Michael
Perpurnaw my sole executor to this my last
will and Testament.

This the 27th day of July A D 1846
