State of North Carolina In the Name of God Amen
 Moore County — S. Alexander Buie
 of the County and State aforesaid at the Locality of Newy
 full of perfect Mind and Memory thanks be to God for his
 Mercy to me for the same after Commanding my Soul
 to God who gave it and my Body to the dust from whence
 it came I do make and ordain this my last will and
 Testament. In the first place I desire my Body to be
 decently interred without pomp or splendor at discretion
 of my Executors. Secondly I desire all my just debts to be
 paid for which I lay out a certain piece of Land on
 the North East Side of Upper Little River containing
 one hundred acres more or less and the rest of my
 Lands and property to remain as it is until the
 Youngest of my Children is of age and then to have
 an equal division between my Wife and Children
 and in the last place I make and ordain my wife
 Margaret Buie Will Buie and Margaret Buie
 my daughter Executrix of this my last Will and
 Testament. in witness whereof I have counterset
 my hand and Seal this the 29th day of March in
 the year of our Lord 1818.

Personally appeared before me Subscribed W. Bryde one of the Justices
 of the Randolph County Thomas Cole and Rev. McDowell who being duly sworn on the
 say foregoing Day Almighty God I pose and say that they are at the Dwelling
 House of James W. Hartland who had lately removed into said County on the
 Night of Saturday the 20th of February last past 1818 the said Wm. Bryde
 was very sick. That he called these defendants to his bed side and requested
 them to take Notice and be testifying that he appointed John R. Adam and
 Duncan McLean of the town of Tryonville to be his Executors and to see
 to his children after his death. These defendants further say that they
 saw the said James W. Hartland on the first day when he still continued
 very sick and that he died the next day Monday the 22^o of February 1819
 and further said Defendants say not.
