North Carolina Moore County January 4th day 1810
 Now in the Name of God I make this my last Will and
 Testament. 1st I bequeath to my Daughter Janet McKenzie
 five Shillings. Second I bequeath Rebecca five Shilling
 Third I bequeath Alexander five Shilling, fourth I bequeath
 to my Son Kenneth all my Landy fifth only for my wife Isabell
 one third of this plantation her time and all the household
 furniture and Stock to be her and at her discretion only the
 Land to be kenneth at her death; and here I set my hand and
 Seal the day and year above written

In the Name of God I make this my last Will and Testament
 of North Carolina being in alone State of health, and according to the course of
 Nature before the time of my departure out of this world to his Regs abrand
 and being in sound mind and memory blessed be God for his Mercies
 I Appoint and Ordain this as my last Will and Testament (to-wit)
 and command my sole to Almighty God to his first gavest, and my body to the
 Elements my soul to Almighty God in a Christian manner, then to remain till the
 grave to be buried in a decent Christian manner, then to remain till the
 Resurrection Morn when Scotland hony will be again reunited, and my
 worldly goods as follow: 1st I give to my beloved
 wife Deborah the land wherein I now live with all my Stock of every
 kind household furniture, and furnishing thereon during her lifetime
 and after her death to become the property of my Daughter Katherine
 and if any disputes shall hereafter arise between her and my son Duncan
 about the land I direct that Duncan & John & Daniel shall
 shall Cuter the land which gave to my daughter Katherine, and my son
 Duncan is bound at the end of two years after to buy her the Colation
 and the lands to became his and his heirs - Second I give and bequeath to
 my sons Daniel, Duncan, Angus, and Alexander the parcels of land
 which formerly gave to them - Third I give to my son Angus the gun I now
 own if he will return to this place of birth to be the property of my grand
 son Duncan - fourth and lastly I bequeath and ordain my son
 Daniel to execute this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this 8th day of February 1811

(25) William Patersons Will

In the Name of God I make
 William Paterson of the County of Moore and State
 of North Carolina living of sound and perfect mind and
 Memory of God be it known to all men that on the 28th day of December in
 the year of our Lord 1812 made and publish this my last
 Will and Testament in manner and form following first
 I give and bequeath to my beloved Son Caleb Alfred Paterson
 and John Calvin Paterson all my Landed Estate to be equally
 Equitably divided between them when my son John Calvin
 Paterson shall attain to the age of Twenty one years and not
 before deserving to my beloved wife Mary Paterson sufficient
 subsistence in any part of the Lands she shall make choice
 of - Secondly I do desire and direct that the Negro Woman
 Comes the Black Smith tools and Gun Stocking tools be sold to
 the best advantage either by Publick or private sale as shall
 be deemed most expedient and the Money arising from such sale
 to be put to the purpose of purchasing a Negro boy which
 boy when purchased shall be considered a property general in
 the family and not vested in either specially - Further order and
 direct that the Negro boy Nathan the Butcher Girl Lucy
 together with the boy directed to be purchased as above be kept
 in the family without any division until my son John
 Calvin Paterson attain to the age of Twenty one years then they
 with the increase of any to be equally divided between my
 wife Mary Paterson my son Caleb Alfred Paterson and
 my son John Calvin Paterson - All my Stock and personal
 property of what ever description it may be Land and slave to be
 kept together for the use of the family in General except what it shall
 be necessary to dispose of the surplus of the Stock for the support of the
 Family or Education of the Children. Further order and direct that
 Earth of my son Caleb Alfred Paterson and John Calvin
 Paterson be intitled to demand their equal or third part of the
 Stock and personal property upon their attaining to the age of twenty
 one and thereby make and ordain my beloved wife Mary Paterson
 Executrix and my worthy friends John Paterson and David Davis
 Kinmen Executors of this my last Will and Testament in witness
 Whereof the 28th William Paterson has signed set my hand and
 seal the day and year first above written
