Thomas J. Clegg Will

In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas J. Clegg of the County of Moore and State of North Carolina being of sound Mind & Memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner & form following that is to say. First, I desire my Executor to pay all my just debts. Second, I will and do bequeath to my wife five Negroes & Slaves and their increase (viz) Maria & Childs, George, Ann & Lucy and two thousand dollars with interest from the time this being the property I received from her by Marriage. Third, Having been engaged with W. B. Clegg in conducting a partnership business under the firm style of W. B. Clegg & Co. and it being impossible at present to ascertain whether or not the said firm has made or lost money it is my will and desire that if upon a settlement of the said partnership, we should not have made money sufficient to remunerate W. B. Clegg for his services during the existence of the said partnership, then & in that event, my executor shall pay to him such sum as will in his opinion be a fair and reasonable compensation for the said services. All the balance of my property of every description I give & bequeath to my wife.

And Lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my brother J. A. Clegg my Executor, In witness whereof the said Tho. J. Clegg do hereunto set my hand & seal this the 3rd day of April A.D. 1862.
