

Ann. Graham's Will
In the Name of God I command
I Am Ann Graham of the
County of Moore and State of North Carolina
being weak in body but of sound mind & perfect
mind and memory I beseech be almighty god
for the same do make and publish this
my last will and testament in manner and
form following that is to say first I give
and bequeath to my beloved Son Dugald
Graham Fort Acre of land on which my
dwelling and other houses stand and it
is my will and wish that my beloved
daughter Nancy Graham have the benefit
of said fort acre of land with the improvements
thereon as long as she may live
With her said brother Dugald
Secondly I give and bequeath to my son Dugald
Graham all my Interest in the Remainder
trust or parcels of land belonging to me
connected with the homestead of forty
an acre as above described
Thirdly I give and bequeath my Negro girl
Henny equally to my son Dugald and my
daughter Nancy Graham
Fourthly I give and bequeath to my Grand
daughter Mary Gillis Twenty two
dollars in money Fifty Dollars and
bequeath my interest in the stock of
Cattle and sheep equally between my son
Dugald & Daughter Nancy Graham
Fifthly I give and bequeath to my son Arch
Graham Twenty five dollars. Sixthly I
give and bequeath to my daughter
Sarah Cameron one hundred
dollars in her own right to use
she may think proper and lastly
I leave my interest in the house
furniture to be divided equally

between deceased Harry Gillis and
her daughter Mary Gillis also a rifle
Gun & my stone & ch. and old jug to
my son Dugald Graham who is
nearly appointed sole Executor of this
my last will and testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal the 29 day of March
1835
