My Last Will & Testament

In the Name of God Amen
 I Archibald Currys of the State of North Carolina and County
 of Moore being weak in Body and fare advanced in Years though
 in perfect Mind and Memory and knowing the uncertainty of
 all Human Affairs and being desirous to settle My worldly
 business do make and publish this My last will and testament
 in the words following - In the first place I recommend My
 soul to God and My body to the dust and My worldly Goods
 as follows I give and bequeath to My son James Currie
 My Grist Mill and all the Appurtenances thereto belonging except
 that My son Will Currie May graunt to me free while he livs
 on the part of the Lands that I have given him. I also give
 to said James My Still and all the necessary Utensils
 for stilling - I also give and bequeath to my two Married
 Daughters Mary Willman and Sarah Thomas one Cow and
 Calf each or ten Dollars in Money whatever the property is
 divided - and to My daughter Margaret two hams and Cakes
 and to My son John one Cow and Calf and forty Dollars
 to be paid him by My son James to buy him Carpenter
 tools when he is done his Apprenticeship at the Carpenter
 business - To My daughter Margaret Currie one Head and
 Head Cloath - To My son Will ten Head of Hogs that
 came of the Stock bought at Grahams Sale and one
 Horse one Blanket one peat and one Shotted on Child -
 all the house hold furniture Belonging both to the Kitchen
 and dwelling to use to belong to My son James one half
 of the farming utensils to be My son Will when he goes a
 House keeping. My gun to be the property of my son James
 the balance of My Stock of cattle to be Equally divided
 between My sons James and Will after all my testa-
 ments are paid - I make and ordain My friend Angus
 Kelly Executor of this My last will and testament -
 Is also signed published and declared to be My last Will
 and testament in presence of Archibald Currie ^{his}
 John Currie

 testament - I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Maria
 Dugraffinwick the use and enjoyment of all my Estate both real and
 personal of every kind and description for and during her life pro-
 vided she remains a widow and on the further Condition that she
 Maintains and Educates our Child John Joseph Dugraffinwick
 Clear of any Charge to the Farmer and in the event of her Marry-
 ing again My Will is that My property be then Equally divided
 between My wife and Child and that the part allotted to the
 Child be immediately taken pay of me or by his guardian and
 that the other half remain in possession of My wife during
 her life and at her death I will and bequeath her part also
 to our said son John Joseph and his heirs and there by nominate
 and appoint My friend Robert Palmer of Chatham County
 the Executor of this My last will and testament - Witness My Hand
 and Seal the 13th of October 1823
