In the Name of God Amen
 I Sarah Dunlap of the State of North Carolina and County of Moore being fair and sound in years but of sound Mind and Memory Calling to mind that it is appointed for all persons once to Die and believing that my Dissolution is not very Distant, have thought proper to dispose of what little property God hath blessed me with in the following Manner and form

First I request that my body may be buried in a decent and Christian like Manner
 Second I Give and bequeath to my Wife below Grand Daughter Elizabeth Phillips daughter of Jeph Phillips one bed and furniture bedstead and bed board, one Cow and calf and one Pig third the ballance of my Estate or property including my part of the land, I Give and bequeath to the following persons (to wit) to the said Elizabeth Phillips my Son Cornelius Dunlap Benjamin Dunlap my Daughter Phiba Dunlap (Fanny) Dunlap daughter of my Son James Dunlap Sally Overton Mr Crummon daughter of John Mc Crummon Mary Dunlap daughter of my Son Dunlap Decd. Mary Mc Crummon daughter of Isaac Mc Crummon by his first Wife, Hannah Decd.

David Overton Mr Crummon son of Donald Mc Crummon by his last Wife Mary Henry Overton Dunlap son of Samuel Dunlap & Nancy Eagle daughter of Jacob Eagle to be Equally Divided among them Share and Share alike -

Thereby nominate constitute and appoint Cornelius David Overton and his Son Cornelius David Executors to this my last Will and Testament

Sarah Dunlap's Will

Moore County Court August Term 1837
 The last will and Testament of Sarah Dunlap decd was admitted to probate by the oath of Malcom Mc Crummon one of the Subscribing witnesses thereto and ordered to be recorded and it is recorded in Book B Page 106 in words at full length -
 Cornelius David Senr and his Son Cornelius David the Executors appointed by said will come in to open court and was duly qualified as Executors to said last Will and Testament -

Archd. Shields Will

The last will and Testament of Archibald Shields Senr of Moore County North Carolina Whereas knowing that it is appointed for men once to Die do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament I recommend my Soul to God and my Body to be Decently by my Executor and friends -
 1st I Give to my Sons Patrick and Archy Shields all the Land lying on the South Side of Pater Creek Beginning at the mouth of the creek up the various courses of the Creek that strikes my line of one hundred and fifty acres the course of that line to the river Down the various courses to the beginning & Archy to have the Buildings and the Store makes both fifteen Barrels of Corn seven hundred bundles of Stalk to fodder two pigs to kill one sow and pigs the Choice of the flock and my bed and furniture and wearing cloths -

Archd. Shields Will

- 2^d. I Give to my Son Benjamin the money coming from Bryan and to Collect it.
 3^d. All the Balance of my property to be sold and divided between Ely. Thomas, and Cornelius after paying my just debts.
 4th. Should my Son Benjamin fail to Collect the money due from Bryan's Estate then he is to Come in and share equally with the three last named Children.
 5th. I hereby appoint my Brother Cornelius Shields and my Son Patrick my Executors to this my last Will and Testament signed and sealed this 6th day of June 1837 in presence of D. Streets Archd. Shields (Real) James Shields.

Codicil to the last Will of the testator
 1st. My Sons Patrick and Archy to have the buildings jointly untill Archy is twenty one years of age
 2^d. If Archy will go away the buildings to belong to Patrick and he shall have the refusal of buying the land and my Bazaar for his wife
 3^d. My Executors shall sell such property as they see proper immediately signed and sealed this 10th day of June 1837 Archd. Shields (Real) in presence of D. Streets

Moore County Court August Term 1837
 My last will and Testament of Archibald Shields deceased was admitted to probate by the oaths of Donald Street and James Shields the Subscribing witnesses thereto,

and the codicil to said will proven by the oaths of Donald Street the Subscribing witnesses thereto and signed to be recorded, Cornelius Shields and Patrick Shields the Executors appointed by said will come into open court and were duly qualified as Executors to said last will and Testament.

William M. Aulley Will

In the name of God Amen August the 15th day 1836
 I William M. Aulley of Moore County and State of North Carolina being in a low state of health but in perfect mind and memory. Thanks be to Almighty God, and being sensible of the uncertain state of this transitory life and knowing that all flesh must yield to death, when it shall please God to call, do make, constitute, declare and declare. This to be my last Will and Testament in manner and form following. Resolving and Announcing by these presents as and every other Testament or Testaments Will or Wills hereafter by me made and declared either by Word or Writing, and this to be taken only as my last Will and Testament, and none other —

1st I give and bequeath to my dear wife the sum of \$1000.00 paid out of my personal Estate.

2^d I desire that my body may be decently put in the earth from whence it came

3^d I give and bequeath to my loving Children and Grandchildren as follows: To wit, First I give and bequeath unto the Children of my daughter Margaret Blackmon Dec^r Negro Slave John and increase if any to them and their heirs for ever with their increase &c

4th I give and bequeath to all the Children that my son Robert M. Aulley has or may have by his present wife my Negro girl Nell to them and their heirs for ever and her increase &c
