In the name of God Amen

I Daniel B. Black being weak of Body but sound
 of mind and memory do make this my last will
 and Testament resigning my body to the Earth and
 my soul unto the hand of Almighty God who gave
 it.

I devise and bequeath unto my dear and beloved
 wife Ann Three Hundred and sixty acres of Land in
 five different surveys including the Houses and
 improvements also all that part of one hundred
 acres which I received of brother John B. Black
 excepting the fields commonly called the Swamp
 fields and all that is now cleared of said Survey on
 the North side of the improvements on which
 Mother now lives

I also devise and bequeath unto my beloved wife
 Ann my negro woman Lenna and her child Sarah
 Jane and my girl Luemila also my mare and calf
 also all my stock of cattle hogs and sheep with
 the exception of what may be necessary to pay my debts
 also my Gigs & harness also all my house hold and
 kitchen furniture also my clock and my rifle gun
 as much of the crop as will be necessary for the support
 of her and family twelve months with all my farming
 tools

I devise and bequeath unto my sisters Margaret and
 Hark & Black all of my part of the one hundred acres
 of Land on which my Mother now lives and the fields
 commonly called the Swamp fields on the part of
 one hundred acres which I received of brother John
 B. Black which was Patented to him together with
 all that is cleared on my part of said Survey on the
 North side of the improvements on which my Mother
 now lives

I direct that my two horses be sold to pay my
 debts and also my wagon my shot gun all the
 tools not necessary for the farm and as much of
 the stock of all kinds as may be necessary
 I also direct that my Executor collect all money
 due to me and apply them to the payment of my
 debts

I conclude by appointing my friend & Brother
 John B. Black my Executor This 30 day of September
 A.D. 1860
