In the name of God Amen

I Daniel B. Black being weak of body but sound
of mind and memory do make this my last Will
and Testament reserving my body to the Earth and
my soul unto the hand of Almighty God who gave

I devise and bequeath unto my dear and beloved
wife Ann Three Hundred and Sixty acres of Land in
five different Survey's including the Houses and
improvements also all that part of one hundred
acres which I received of brother John B. Black
excepting the fields commonly called the swamp
fields and all that is now clear'd of said Survey on
the North side of the improvements on which
Mother now lives

I allot desire and bequeath unto my beloved wife
Anne my negro woman Anna and her child Stroke
Isaac and my girl Lucretia also my mare and colt
also all my Stock of cattle hogs and Sheep with
the exception of what may be necessary to pay my debts
also my Guy & harness also all my house hold & and
Kitchen furniture also my clock and my rifle gun
as much of the crop as will be necessary for the support
of her and family twelve months with all my farming
tools

I desire and bequeath unto my sisters Margaret and
Elizabeth Black all of my part of the one hundred acres
of Land on which my Mother now lives and the fields
commonly called the swamp fields on the part of
one hundred acres which I received of brother John
B. Black which was Palanted to him together with
all that is clear'd on my part of said Survey on the
North side of the improvements on which my Mother
now lives

I direct that my two horses be sold to pay my
debts and also my wagon my shot gun all the
tools not necessary for the farm and as much of
the Stock of all kinds as may be necessary

I also direct that my Executor collect all money
due to me and apply them to the payment of my
debts

I conclude by appointing my friend & Brother
John B. Black my Executor This 3rd day of September
A.D. 1860
