plantation that I own on the North Side of Deep River with all other household furniture and Stock that is not willed to my other Children I say my will and pleasure is that my beloved Son in law David Kennedy shall have and enjoy by the same after my death and a my wife with provided he will be dutiful to us and take care of us during our lives and if my son in law David Kennedy should be said to be dutiful to us my desire and will is that any other of my Children that will be dutiful to us and take care of us shall enjoy the same and I hereby make and ordain my worthy friend David Kennedy executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I the said Edward Moore have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal the Day and year first above written
