In the Name of God Amen I John Cameron of the County of Moore in the State of North Carolina do hereby certify that I am of sound and perfect Mind and Memory I do hereby certify that I do this 5th day of August in the year of our Lord 1823 Make and publish this my last Will and Testament in Manner following that is to say after paying all my Just debts and funeral Expenses I give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Mary all my Land and Stocks of all kinds during her Natural life I leave to my son Alexander Cameron one Negro girl named Basket I leave to my son Daniel Cameron one Negro woman named Hannah and all the stock after the death of my Wife Mary I leave my daughter Margaret one Negro Girl named Rose I leave to my Daughter Mary one Negro Boy named Benjamin I leave to my two grand sons John Munroe and Peter Munroe and their Mother Jane Munroe one Negro girl named Hanna shall have for her life time, provided she never marry no other Man but if she marry after the death of my daughter the Negro girl named Hanna shall be taken from her. I leave to my daughter Anna and her children one Negro girl named Fanny, provided she never marry no other Man after the death of my son John if she does the said Fanny and her increase shall be taken from her and given to her
