named Hannah and all the Stock after the death of  
my wife Mary I leave my daughter Margaret one  
Negro Girl named Rose I leave to my Daughter Mary  
one Negro boy named Benjamin I leave to my two  
grand Sons John Monroe and Peter Monroe and  
their Mother Jane Monroe one Negro girl named  
Hannah that have her her life time provided she  
never Marry No other Man but if she Marry after the  
death of my beloved Monroe the Negro girl named Hannah  
shall be taken from her. I leave to my daughter  
Anna and her children one Negro girl named  
Fanny, provided she never Marry No other Man after the  
decease of whom son if she does she said Fanny  
and her issues shall be taken from her and given to her

ten Dollars. I leave the Land to be divided between my two

My Gun to this last will and testament in writing witness

for her proper use and benefit. 4<sup>th</sup> I will and bequeath to my daughter  
Catherine W. Daffey the sum of ten Dollars, the Ballance of my pro-

# John Martins Will

John Martin of Moore County and State of North Carolina  
Make this my last will and testament in manner and  
form following — I give to my Brother Murdoch Martin four  
Negroes, viz, Harry and his wife Abby, Sam & his child Penny  
one Dish and Book case — I give and bequeath to my sister  
Catharine Martin four hundred Dollars —

I give and bequeath to my Sister Margaret Martin two hundred  
Dollars — Give and bequeath to my Sister Florah Black two  
Hundred Dollars and one feather Bed and furniture —  
I give and bequeath to the heirs of William Martin six  
Hundred Dollars to be equally divided among the six children  
Margaret, Sarah Catharine, John, Lydia and William and to  
Catharine I give one feather Bed and furniture — I give and  
bequeath to my Sister Florah W. Martin fifty Dollars let should  
she die without issue it is my will that the sum left her  
by this will should be divided between Margaret Martin  
and Florah Black — It is my will that my Executors  
sell all my lands (viz) one hundred and forty acres on  
West Creek known by the name of the Haddell Land

Sixty Acres on Scotchman's Creek South of Deep River and three  
Hundred and Eighty Acres on Bear Creek being the half of 770 acres  
deeded by the Sheriff to Mr. Morrison and my self — It is my will  
and desire that my Executor dispose of my Bank Stock, four shares  
in the Cape Fear Bank, & the rest according to it is my will and  
desire that my Executor pay Elizabeth Morrison and Margaret Martin  
as soon as convenient the sums left them by this will — It is my  
will that Donald Martin (my nephew) should have my Boxes  
Saddle and Bridle and my wearing apparel — I nominate  
and appoint Murdoch Martin, Archibald Brydges and Elias  
Jones Executors of this my last will and testament —

Eliza, but in case my son Thos. W. Will should die before his Mother  
I will and ordain that she should leave his heir — and I also desire  
that my son Thos. as aforesaid shall be liberally educated out of his property  
I authorise my Executors to sell any part of the Name of Jack Fisher  
at publick or private sale or any other property that I possess
