Isaac League's Will

In the Name of God Amen I Isaac League of the County of Warren and
State of North Carolina being of sound and Memory but failing to mind
the State of my Mortality knowing that it is now for me to die
I think proper to publish this my last Will and Testament which is as
follows: First I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth
League the plantation now lying or during her life, to have & to hold the
possession of my daughter Rachael house and garden with the priviledge
of interring her Garden and fire wood and at my wife's death
and if she should think proper to give it up before her death the
plantation with all the land belonging to it to be my son Jacob
League. Next I give and bequeath to my beloved wife the old
horse and saddle and also horned cow and Calf and one Barrow
hog and four sheep and two hens and furniture will all the
Kitching, purniture &c. Next I give and bequeath to my son Isaac
League the little Hall House that lies near and lay with mine my
daughter Rachael the chest at my wife's death and all the Bedchairs
of my Estate to be sold and all my just debts paid and the Balance
to be Equally divided among all my Children Jacob excepted for
lastly I beseeche make and Appoint my beloved son Isaac
League and my grand son Isaac League my Executrix to execute this
my last Will & Testimony this 10th of June 1825 Isaac League
is to interring the deceased name in this Will was duly countersigned by

Mary Montgomery's Will

I Mary Montgomery do Make Publish and declare the
following to be my last Will and testament

After paying all my just debts and funeral Expences my Will is
that my property be divided as follows

I Will and bequeath to my daughter Deborah Dubrury my Large
Soothing Glass now at Mr. James Gaines also my Silver Cane but
it is my request that at her death she give said Cane to son
Joseph.

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Hill wife of
John Hill fifty Dollars and the rest I have at Mr. James Gaines
I give and bequeath to my nephew George Wilcox of Chatham
County Thirty five Dollars.

I give and bequeath to the widow Thompson widow of John
Thompson Esq. wife of Chatham County ten Dollars

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Gaines four hundred
Dollars to be paid out of a Note which Gabriel Dubrury gave me
in his lifetime for sixteen hundred Dollars to be paid
to the said Elizabeth five years after my death and if the
aforesaid James Gaines should make any charge against
me for Board or living in his family it is to be deducted
from this legacy to his wife.

I give and bequeath to the Children of my Daughters Mary
and Haddie each four hundred Dollars to be Equally
divided among them share and share alike and to be
paid out of the aforesaid Note given to me by Gabriel Dubrury
five years after my death.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Deborah Dubrury all the
remainder of my property both real and personal of every kind
and description on conditions that she or her Heirs or Assignees
find and set up suitable Head Stone for my Husband and my
Graves after my decease and she is to charge no Board for me
while I shall be living in her family.

And lastly I nominate my friends Robert Palmer & Archibald Grayde
the executors of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand
