Isaac Tague's Will

In the Name of God Amen I Isaac Tague of the County of York and State of North Carolina being of sound and Memory but feeling the frailty of my Mortality knowing that it is ever for me to die I have caused to publish this my last Will and Testament which is as follows I do first Give and bequeath unto my beloved Wife Sarah Tague the plantation now live on during her life I reserve to the children of my daughter Rachel house and garden with the privilege of enlarging her garden and live blood and at my last death unless she should think proper to give it up before her death the plantation with all the Lands belonging to it to be my son Jacob Tague's. That I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife the old horse and saddle and also horned Cow and calf and one Barrow Pig and four Shocks and her bed and furniture with all the kitchen furniture &c. That I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Tague the little Wall House that I give and bequeath unto my daughter Rachel the chest at my Wife's death and all the Ballance of the Estate to be sold and all my just debts paid and the Ballance to be equally divided among all my Children Jacob Esq. for Lastly I do constitute Make and appoint My beloved son Isaac Tague and my grand son Isaac Tague My Executors to execute this my last Will &c. this 10th of June 1824 Isaac Tague (Seal)

The Executor named in this will was duly qualified &c.

Mary Montgomery's Will

I Mary Montgomery do Make Publish and declare the following to be my last Will and Testament

After paying all my just debts and funeral Expenses My Will is that my property be divided as follows

I will and bequeath to my daughter Deborah Dubutz my large Looking Glass now at Mr. James Gains also my silver box but it is my request that at her death she give said box to her Son Joseph.

I give and bequeath to my grand daughter Mary Hill Wife of John Hill fifty Dollars and the said Mary have at Mr. James Gains I give and bequeath to my Nephew George Wilcox of Chatham County thirty five Dollars.

I give and bequeath to the same Thompson Widow of John Thompson Esq. late of Chatham County ten Dollars

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Gains four hundred Dollars to be paid out of a Note which Gabriel Dubutz gave me in his lifetime for sixteen hundred Dollars to be paid to the said Elizabeth five years after my death and if the aforesaid James Gains should make any charge against me for board or living in his family it is to be deducted from this legacy to his life.

I give and bequeath to the Children of my Daughter Margaret Waddell and four hundred Dollars to be equally divided among them share and share alike and to be paid out of the aforesaid Note given to me by Gabriel Dubutz five years after my death.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Deborah Dubutz all the Remainder of my property both Real and personal of every kind and description on Conditions that she or her heirs or Representatives find and set up suitable Head Stones for my Husband and my Grave after my decease and she is to charge the Board for me while I ~~was~~ was living in her family -

And lastly I nominate my friends Robert Palmer & Richard Bryan the Executors of this my last Will and Testament. Witness my hand and seal this 8th of May 1824 Mary Montgomery (Seal)
