Ann, Flora, Jane, Elizabeth and Margaret Bell

This 31st day of March 1849
I do hereby appoint my son Blake Watson
Executor to this my last will and testament

before I depart hence, I desire to make my wishes known
I wish my daughter Sarah to be my Executor, and
I wish her if it be in her power to pay off all
my just debts of every description but I know she cannot
do so without selling a part of what little property
she has & I hope some friend will aid her and assist
her I leave it altogether to herself to Judge what
she shall sell, either a part of the land or stock
of cattle hogs or Sheep & when she sells enough to
pay off all my just debts the balance to be all
her own means stock of every description house
hold & kitchen furniture farming utensils &c.
to be hers to support her during her natural
life, and if there is any thing left she can
will it or give it to any one she may think
proper this is my wish and my request and I do
hope that some friend will aid her and assist her
to receive enough to support during her natural
