John Baker's will

In the name of God amen August the twenty second Day A.D. 1836 I John Baker Son of the County of Moore and State of North Carolina being sick in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be to Almighty God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that all must yield to death when it shall please God to call them—do make, constitute, ordain and declare this to be my last will and testament in manner and form following Revoking and annulling by these presents all and every other will or testament heretofore by me made and this to be my last will and testament and no other In the first place principally and first of all I recommend my soul to the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like Burial at the Discretion of my executors hereafter named nothing doubting but of the General Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God And as touching such worldly Estate as it has pleased God to bless me with in this life I give, Devise and dispose of in the manner and form as follows.— in the first place My Desire is that all my just Debts may be punctually paid— Then I Give and bequeath to my beloved son John Baker one negro boy named John to him and his heirs forever— Then I Give and bequeath to my beloved son Archibald Baker three negroes named Mimy Rhodia and Pasley and half of my stock of Hogs to him and his heirs forever— Then I Give and bequeath to my beloved Daughter Jimmy Campbell one negro boy named Henry to be lived out by my Executors until the said Demsey's Death and the money arising for said

Here to be given to her by my said Executor or executors annually to her own proper use until her death then the said Negro Boy Henry to be given to the heirs of the said James Campbell Body forever

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Mary McKinnis one negro Girl named Mary to her and her heirs forever—

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Daughter Margaret McKinnis one negro Girl named L. Angerer and one feather bed to her and her heirs forever—

Item I Give and bequeath unto my beloved Daughter Catharine Baker one negro Girl named Mahala and one negro boy named Nestley and one half of my stock of hogs all my cattle also one bay horse together with all my household and kitchen furniture except one bed and its furniture that I Give to my Daughter Margaret McKinnis also my Farming utensils to her and her heirs forever—

Item I Give and bequeath to my loving Grand Daughter Catharine Campbell one negro Girl named Britannia to her and her heirs forever—

Item My Desire is that my old negro woman named Henry may live with my Children with which one of them she may think it best to stay with—

Item I have Deeded all my land to my two sons John and Archibald Baker except fifty acres of that part which I Deeded to Archibald my Daughter Catharine Baker is to have including the house wherein I now live to them and her heirs forever—
