

John Huchabee's Will

In the name of God Amen. I John Huchabee of the County of Moore Being of sound and perfect mind and memory blessed be God, do this Sixteenth day of Sept. in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and two, make and publish this my last will and Testament in the manner following. That is to say - First I bequeath unto my beloved wife Jane, during her natural life, the use of the plantation whereon I now live and two Negroes to wit a fellow named Dick and a woman named Lucy also one feather bed and furniture one horse and two cars and calves - Item I give and bequeath unto my son James Huchabee one Negro boy named Dick and the Negro fellow Dick which I bequeath to my wife Jane during her life to him and his heirs forever - Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Abby one Negro woman named Bidda with her children Isaac Anna and Fred to her and her heirs for ever - Item I give and bequeath unto my son Richard Huchabee one Negro woman named Edith, one Negro fellow named Randal and Negro boy named Ned to him and his heirs forever - Item I give and bequeath unto my son Benjamin Huchabee the land whereon I now live, also one Negro fellow named Bob, one Negro boy named Daniel one Negro boy named Frank and the Negro woman named Lucy, which I have lent my wife Jane during her life, one Bay horse which is now in his possession two cars and calves one Bed and furniture the further Negroes, three pewter plates and one pewter dish to him and his heirs for ever - Item I give and bequeath unto my five grand children, Jane Blodsoe, Mary Blodsoe, Harmer Blodsoe, John Blodsoe, and Sara Blodsoe two hundred dollars to be equally divided among them to them and their heirs for ever - Item I give and bequeath unto my son in law Abraham Blodsoe five shillings to him and his heirs for ever -

96 Appropriated to the use of the Family. I also desire my Executors to give my children a liberal Education until my Estate and I desire unto Elice Smith my nephews 30 dollars, to pursue his Education. My desire is, that the Solemn Grave, be a doing should be aided, by my Executors as far as they conceive themselves, able, without injuring my estate my Books I leave to the use of my dear wife and Family, and I hereby make appoint Patrick Smith, Duncan Smith, Lauchlin McNeill, John McNeill, Elice Smith, Elice McNeill and Murdoch McMillan full and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament; hereby revoking dijan nulling and making all former wills and bequeaths by me made, declaring this only to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal, this the 16 March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and five.

I Aron Tyson of the County of Moore in the State of North
Carolina, do declare the following to be my last will and
Testament - After paying all my debts, my will and
desire is, that my estate, both real and personal, be disposed
of in the following manner - I give to my dear wife
Lydia Tyson, the following Articles to be at her disposal.

Two large Ploughs two small ones, two shovel ploughs
four weeding hoes one garden hoe, one grubbing Hoe, one
mattock, one spade and two shovels. One wagon now in use
another not finished at Edward Shurts, One pair of
Horse gears, two Lett Swingle trees, one Scythe and Cradle
six Reaping hooks, three chub axes, one hand axe, one broad axe
one old Dutch Fan, one large Grindstone, three Dutch Ovens,
five pots, Two Iron Tea Kettles, one Copper Kettle (of thirty gallons)
another Copper Kettle of larger size, four pair fire Dogs, one
Arm Chair, six common Chairs, one Cupboard that stands
in the Kitchen, one large Iron Harrow, three Lugs, of 2 gallons
2 Lugs of 1 gallon and one of half a gallon, three Pickle pots
one hand Bellows, four pair of Tongues and Shovels, Two
Iron wedges, 1 straw knife and box, one Trunk with a
round top. One with a flat lid, nine Leather Beds with
Bedsteads and other furniture belonging to them, Seventy
five head of Cattle to be chosen by her and off my stock, twenty
head of sheep, five head of horses to be chosen by her also, all
my stock of hogs, Ten Geese, one Brin. hook, one Cradle, one pair
of Steelyards in the Smiths Shop, two pitch forks, two Eakes,
one coarse Riddle, one Loom, and the furniture belonging to it,
Two flax wheels, two cotton wheels, three pine tables not
painted, Seven Iron Candlesticks, one Coffee Mill one Sizing
Pan, four bad Irons, one Spine Mortar and pestle;
