I give and bequeath to my Sister Margaret Martin two Hundred Dollars - I give and bequeath to my Sister Sarah Black two Hundred Dollars and one feather Bed and furniture - I give and bequeath to the Heirs of William Martin Six Hundred Dollars to be Equally divided among the Six Children Margaret, Sarah Catharine, John, Sophia and William and to Catharine I give one feather Bed and furniture - I give and bequeath to my Sister Sarah & William fifty Dollars but should she die without issue it is my Will that the sum left her by this Will should be divided between Margaret Martin and Sarah Black - It is my Will that my Executors sell all my Lands & Crops one Hundred and forty acres or less but known by the Name of the Huddell Land
