 make and publish this my last will and  
 Testament

First It is my will and desire that my Executor  
 shall pay all my just debts,  
 Secondly I give and bequeath unto Thomas  
 Cole in Trust for the sole and separate  
 benefit of my beloved Mother Mary Campbell  
 the wife of John A Campbell, all  
 my lands, comprising one hundred  
 and twenty five acres more or less  
 situate the land of John S. S. S. S.  
 Eli Phillips and others  
 also my stock of Cattle, Horses, and  
 one ten horse wagon  
 Thirdly I gave and bequeath unto the  
 said Thomas Cole in trust as aforesaid  
 for the sole benefit of my Mother Mary  
 Campbell all my property and  
 interest in whatsoever it may consist of  
 in any way to make her comfortable life  
 but after her death it is my will and  
 Testament that my Executor shall sell  
 and equally divide all that remains  
 of my Estate that I have willed for the  
 benefit of my Mother Mary Campbell  
 uniformly in the hands of said  
 Thomas Cole trustee as aforesaid at  
 her death among all of her  
 children or their survivors.  
 I hereby constitute nominate  
 and appoint my worthy friend  
 Thomas Cole my whole and  
 sole Executor to this my last  
 Will and Testament

 the Subscribing witnesses thereto It is  
 therefore considered by the Court that  
 the said paper writing and every part  
 thereof is the last Will and Testament  
 of the said John P. Campbell and  
 the same is ordered to be recorded &  
 filed. And therefore the said  
 Thomas Cole executor as aforesaid  
 duly qualified as such by  
 taking the oath required by  
 law
