Date of the 6th day of May
Anne County,

To the Name of God Amen I John Wadsworth, of the
State of North Carolina, being of sound mind, & perfect
Mind make this my last Will and Testament in View
of the uncertainty of Life and the certainty of death do make
Establish and publish thereby my last Will and Testament
in these manner and form following down.

First. I give and bequeath to my wife Mrs. Sarah
during her Natural life a land which and her death
or marriage to my two other children Sarah & Elizabeth
and her heirs at law all my Lands together with the
Improvements thereon in Seven acres I appraise to be
about three hundred acres all my Stock of Hogs Cattle
Horses Sheep My Waggon and Gear all my Tools and
Furniture of what ever all my Clothing tools and every other
Article of Property of and about a said estate or even unto
Market bearing.

Secondly. I give and bequeath to my Grand Children
John Burroughs, Lissney and Lydia Children of Peter &
~~He~~ and Catharine Shultz one Hundred and fifty
Acres of Land in the County of Moore of said Peter
devoted to me by Name Mr. Bell Lawyer Sheriff of the
County aforesaid to be Equally divided between them, or
with for their benefit when the last mentioned Child dies before
arrives to the Age of twenty one years until which time the said
Land or the profits arising therefrom are to be applied to the Support
and Schooling of said Children.

Thirdly. I hereby invest my Executors with full and ample
power to sell any part of the property devised to my wife Sarah and
at her death or Marriage to my Children Sarah Elizabeth and
Catharine at any time when it may appear to them to be
desirable to do so and the proceeds arising from such sale
or sales to be appraised agreeably to the Will of the Director.
Fourthly. I give it on my Executors in case my Wife Sarah
shall die or marry before my Children Sarah Elizabeth
and Catharine at law arrive to the age of twenty one years
