

177 Julius Glascock's will.

In the name of God Amen.
I Julius Glascock of the County of Moors and State of North Carolina, being sick, and weak of body but of sound and disposing mind memory and understanding, considering the certainty of death, but the uncertainty of the time thereof, do make and declare this my last will and Testament, in manner and form following. That is to say.

First my will is that after my decease my body shall be decently buried and that my Executors (Whom after named) shall pay, all funeral expenses, together with all my just debts howsoever and to whomsoever owing, out of the monies that may first come into their hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

Secondly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah, two beds and furniture, and two cows & calves, to her and to her disposal absolutely, forever.

Thirdly, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah the Tract or parcel of land whereon I now live to have and to hold to her the said Sarah Glascock for and during the term of her natural life, also one bay mare, all my stock of cattle, hogs & sheep, household and kitchen furniture and all my farming utensils to have hold occupy & enjoy, during the term of her natural life.

Fourthly, It is my will that my Executors after my death, shall sell to the highest bidder my grey mare and that whatever may remain of the proceeds of said sale after paying all my just debts be equally divided amongst my heirs, share and share alike.

I also give and bequeath to my wife Sarah my negro man Sam, and my negro woman Leely for and during the term of her natural life.

Fifthly, It is my will and desire that after the decease of my beloved wife Sarah, the tract or

parcel of Land on which I now reside and which I have bequeathed to her during her natural life, and also my negro and all other personal property that may remain at her death, be sold to the highest bidder at public sale and that the proceeds thereof be equally divided and paid over to my heirs in equal proportion, share and share alike, to them and each and every of them, their Executors Administrators and assigns, absolutely, forever. And I do hereby constitute and appoint my trusty friends James B. Mease & Depts. F. Mease my lawful executors, to all intents & purposes, to execute this my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and every clause thereof, hereby revoking and declining anything previously made - In witness whereof I the said Julius Glascock do hereunto set my hand and seal this the 26th day of July A. D. 1848.

Signed sealed published and declared Julius Glascock and by Julius Glascock to be his last will & Testament in the presence of us who at his request & in his presence do subscribe our names as witnesses thereto.
