State of North Carolina Moore County  
 In the name of God Amen I Peter Sinclair  
 now being of sound mind and disposing  
 memory calling to mind the uncertainty  
 of this mortal life do make publish  
 and declare the following to be my last  
 will and testament First My Will and  
 desire is that funeral expenses and all  
 my just debts be paid and that a  
 sufficient quantity of my personal  
 estate be sold for that purpose Secondly  
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved  
 wife Jessie Sinclair during the period of  
 her natural life all my real and personal  
 estate of every kind and description and  
 after her death to be disposed of as follows  
 (B.I.B) I give and bequeath unto my two  
 daughters Mary and Nancy Sinclair at their  
 mothers death the whole of my real and  
 personal Estate of every kind and description  
 under the following restrictions and re-  
 gulations my daughter Mary to have abso-  
 lutely in her own right the full one half  
 of all my lands of which I shall die seized  
 and possessed by her in life time and after  
 her death to my daughter Nancy Sinclair  
 to her her life time and at her death to  
 my heirs forever I also give to my daughter  
 Nancy Sinclair one half of my personal  
 estate and my said daughter Jessie Sinclair to  
 hold to other half of all my real and personal estate  
 in trust for the benefit of my said daughter Nancy  
 Sinclair I appoint my daughter Nancy Sinclair  
 executrix to my last will and testament  
 in witness whereof I have this the first day of  
 October A.D. 1853 set my hand and have affixed  
 my seal

# Margaret Bruce's Will

In the name of God amen I Margaret Bruce  
 of the County of Moore and State of North Carolina  
 do make and ordain this my last will and Testament  
 as follows to it I give my soul to god who first  
 gave it and resign my flesh to the dust from  
 whence I came I give and bequeath to my  
 wife Catharine McBrayde one hundred acres of  
 land in Cumberland County on McButtens Creek  
 adjoining the lands of Archibald Patterson his own  
 the other hundred I give and bequeath hundred  
 McBrayde and Margaret forrest McBrayde all the  
 residue of my estate to the aforesaid Rachael  
 McBrayde and Margaret Jane McBrayde two of  
 the daughters of my wife Catharine McBrayde to be  
 equally divided between the two said girls and  
 Margaret Bruce aforesaid do nominate and  
 appoint Alexander McBrayde sole executor to this  
 my last will and Testament as witness whereof  
 I have hereunto set my hand and affix my  
 seal this June the 3<sup>rd</sup> A.D. 1850 Margaret <sup>Mc</sup>Brayde  
 wife of James Hunt  
 and S. McBrayde

North Carolina & Court of Pleas and Quarter  
Moore County 3 Septemr 1855  
This was the foregoing paper & being offered  
for probate in Common form by Mr. A. Bryce  
named as executor therin is the last will  
and testament of Margaret Bruce and  
C Dempsey Hank and James Sill C Bryce his  
neices thence being sworn deposed that said  
Margaret Bruce in their presence executed the same  
as her last will and testament and at the time  
was of sound mind and disposing mind and that  
they witnessed the same by her request in her  
presence whereupon the court admitted the  
same to probate in common form and H. W.  
A. Bryce qualified as executor thence to open  
Court let the will be recorded.

I Murdoch Ferguson, of the County of Moore  
and State of North Carolina, being of sound mind  
and memory, but considering the uncertainty of  
my earthly existence, as I am at this time in  
ruble health, do make publish and declare  
this my last will and testament in manner and  
form, following that is to say, first that my  
executor herein after named shall provide  
for my body a decent burial, suitable to the  
wishes of my relations and friends; and pay  
all funeral expenses together with my just  
debts however and to whomsoever owing out  
of the first money that may come into his  
hands as a part or parcel of my estate.

I give and bequeath to my beloved brother  
John Ferguson all the lands whereof I may  
suez and possid at the time of my death  
including the place wheron I immurely  
lived to him and his heirs in fee simple for  
ever. I give and bequeath to my belov  
ed brother John Ferguson my Station, a bay

horse to have and und to hold to him absolute  
ly forever. Item, I give and bequeath to my  
beloved Sister, Sarah Blue, widow of Duncan  
& Blue my Negro boy, Edmund, a slave to her  
and her heirs absolutely forever.

Item, I direct, and it is my will and desire  
that all my stock consisting of cattle and hogs  
be sold and the proceeds be applied to pay my  
debt. Item, I desire also, that my executor sell  
all my household and kitchen furniture, and  
also my car together with my farming utensils  
of my description and the proceeds to be applied  
as in the above item. — Item I give and bequeath  
to my beloved Sister mentioned in ~~another~~  
item my bay mare to her and her heirs forever  
Item, my will and desire is, that if there be any  
money remaining in the hands of my executor after  
paying all my just debts shall be divided equal  
ly between my brother John Ferguson and my sis  
ter, Sarah Blue, both mentioned in former items  
share and share a little. And lastly I do hereby  
constitute Daniel McLeod my lawful executor  
to all intents and purposes to execute this my  
last will and testament, and every part and  
clause thereof according to the true intent and  
meaning of the same, hereby revoking and de  
claring utterly void all other wills and testa  
ments by me before made. In testimony  
whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal  
this the 12th of March A.D. 1855 signed & sealed  
published and declared by Murdoch Ferguson  
to be his last will and testament in the presence  
of us, who at his request and in his presence  
do hereby subscribe our names as witnesses  
to
