

175 Margaret Ray's will.

I Margaret Ray of the County of Elbow and State of North Carolina being of sound mind and memory but considering the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and declare this my last will and Testament in manner and form following that is to say: First that my Executor hereinafter named shall provide for my body a decent burial suitable to the wishes of my relations and friends, and pay all funeral expenses together with my just Debts, honours & to whomsoever owing.

1st I give and bequeath to my brother Arch^t Ray my negro Boy Duv.

2nd I give and bequeath to my brother Arch^t Ray all this tract of Land where on I now live with the improvements there on to have and to hold to him and his heirs in fee simple forever.

3rd I will and bequeath to my Niece Margaret Sam Blue One Hundred Dollars

4th I will and bequeath to my nephew John Calvin Blue fifty Dollars

5th I will and bequeath to my nephew John Alexander Johnson Ray Fifty Dollars.

6th I will that my brother Arch^t Ray pay to the above named heirs the shares which are willed to them in money out of his own funds.

7th I will also that my brother Arch^t Ray pay all my just Debts out of his own funds.

8th I will and desire is that my Aunt Catharine Pendleton Ray shall stay on the place where I now live as long as they live if they think proper to do so.

9th I also will that my sister Eliza Ray stay on the place where I now live as long as she lives singly if she chooses to do so.

Arch^t Ray I do hereby constitute and appoint my Brother Arch^t Ray my lawful Executor to fill intents and purposes to execute this

my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same, and every part and clause thereof.
