 In the name of God Amen I Peter Sinclair
 now being of sound mind and disposing
 memory calling to mind the uncertainty
 of this mortal life do make publish
 and declare the following to be my last
 will and testament First My Will and
 desire is that funeral expenses and all
 my just debts be paid and that a
 sufficient quantity of my personal
 estate be sold for that purpose Secondly
 I give and bequeath unto my beloved
 wife Jessie Sinclair during the period of
 her natural life all my real and personal
 estate of every kind and description and
 after her death to be disposed of as follows
 (B.I.B) I give and bequeath unto my two
 daughters Mary and Nancy Sinclair at their
 mothers death the whole of my real and
 personal Estate of every kind and description
 under the following restrictions and re-
 gulations my daughter Mary to have abso-
 lutely in her own right the full one half
 of all my lands of which I shall die seized
 and possessed by her in life time and after
 her death to my daughter Nancy Sinclair
 to her her life time and at her death to
 my heirs forever I also give to my daughter
 Nancy Sinclair one half of my personal
 estate and my said daughter Jessie Sinclair to
 hold to other half of all my real and personal estate
 in trust for the benefit of my said daughter Nancy
 Sinclair I appoint my daughter Nancy Sinclair
 executrix to my last will and testament
 in witness whereof I have this the first day of
 October A.D. 1853 set my hand and have affixed
 my seal

Margaret Bruce's Will

In the name of God amen I Margaret Bruce
 of the County of Moore and State of North Carolina
 do make and ordain this my last will and Testament
 as follows to it I give my soul to god who first
 gave it and resign my flesh to the dust from
 whence I came I give and bequeath to my
 wife Catharine McBrayde one hundred acres of
 land in Cumberland County on McButtens Creek
 adjoining the lands of Archibald Patterson his son
 McArthur and others I give and bequeath hundred
 McBrayde and Margaret Bruce McBrayde all the
 residue of my estate to the aforesaid Rachael
 McBrayde and Margaret Jane McBrayde two of
 the daughters of my wife Catharine McBrayde to be
 equally divided between the two said girls and
 Margaret Bruce aforesaid do nominate and
 appoint Alexander McBrayde sole executor to this
 my last will and Testament as witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and affix my
 seal this June the 3rd A.D. 1850 Margaret Bruce
 wife of James Hunt
 and S. D. McBrayde
