Robert Mcnabb's Will

I Robt Mcnabb of the County of Moore and
State of North Carolina, being of sound
mind & memory, but considering the
uncertainty of life, do make & declare this
my last Will & Testament in manner &
form following. That is to say, First,
That my Executors hereinafter named
provide for my body a decent burial & pay
my funeral expenses.

1st Item. I will that my Estate remain undivided
for three years, the store lot excepted:
that my wife sell the said lot to
the very best advantage; collect the
debts due me & with them & the proceeds

of the lot pay those I owe. And that she
and my children be supported out of my
Estate during the time.

2nd Item I give and bequeath to my wife & her
heirs forever the following negroes & others
property, Viz. Dicey & Rhoda, my stock of
Horses, Cattle & Hogs, my Wagon, bark,
Barouche & Buggy together with all the
furniture connected with the Hotel,
two choice Beds & Bed Furniture excepted.
And one fourth my Library of Books, those
at William's on Parkham Granville & those
at Henry's home; the plain County included.

3rd Item I give and bequeath to my wife during
the term of her natural life my negro
man Alfred and also the Carthage Hotel
including all the real estate bought of
Dr. G. B. Bruce, during the term of her
natural life.

4th Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Anna
my negro girl Amelia, two choice Beds
& Bed Furniture. One fourth my Library
of Books & my Watch.

5th Item I give and bequeath to my Son Edwin
Lawrence my negro woman Mary and
negro boy Henry, and one fourth my
Library of Books.

6th Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter
Amelia my negro boy Leo & also John
Anders Mary's child, One fourth my
Library of Books: And I give & bequeath
to her my negro man Alfred at the death
of my wife.

7th Item I will that the Carthage Hotel (all the
real estate purchased of Dr. Bruce included)
be sold at the death of my wife, publicly.

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At the Court House door in Carthage on a credit of Six, Twelve & eighteen months (after advertising the property for two months at the Court House & three others of the most public places in the County & for the same length of time in four of the leading news papers in the State) Purchases giving notes bearing interest from date with three approved Securities, and that the proceeds of the property be equally divided between Edwin & Amelia as they become of age

8th Item I will in the event of my Wife & Ann's surviving one or both (Edwin & Amelia) that the whole of their property be equally divided between them (I mean my Wife & Ann) and in the event of their surviving one of them that they share & share alike with the one that may be living.

9th Item I will that the Premium & other expense connected with the Policy on my wife's life be paid annually out of my Estate in order to secure the insurance money to my Children.

10th Item I desire that my Wife (in the management of my Estate) should consult Alex^r Kelly & in Law matters consult his brother Angus R Kelly.

11th Item I appoint my wife Elizabeth sole Executrix of this my last Will & Testament.

12th Item I hereby declare utterly void all other Wills & Testaments by me made. In witness whereof I the said Robt McNabb do hereunto set my hand & seal this 7th day of May A.D. 1851

Cole come into Court and being duly sworn say upon their oath that they were acquainted with the said Robert McNabb and with his hand writing and that they verily believe that the said paper writing & every part thereof together with the Codicil thereto & every part thereof as well the bodies as the signatures of the same are in the proper handwriting of the said Robert McNabb. Whereupon it is considered & adjudged by the Court that the said paper writing with the Codicil thereto is the last Will & Testament of Robert McNabb.

bequeath to him to go to my son Daniel
McGilvray's children. I give and bequeath
to my son Daniel McGilvray my Bed and
Furniture. I give and bequeath all
the residue of my estate of every kind &
description to my son Alexander
McGilvray. In testimony whereof I do
hereby set my hand and seal this

Murdoch McKenzie's Will

In the name of God Amen. I Murdoch
McKenzie of the County of Moore and
State of North Carolina, do make and
publish this my last Will and Testament
in manner & form following, viz.
Item 1st I give to my beloved wife Sarah the
lands on which I now live with all
the stock of cattle and horses and
all other articles of which I may be
in possession at my death with power
to use and enjoy as long as she may
live. At my wife's death I wish all
my property sold and the proceeds equally
divided among my lawful heirs
excepting my lands which I give to my
son Daniel McKenzie. To my daughter
Elizabeth I give my house with all
its furniture as long as she may live
