- 3rd I will and devise that my Executor hereinafter named send to my Sister Mary Cram one hundred Dollars to be paid to her out of the first money that comes to hand -
- 4th I will and devise that provided Levi James of Guilford County does not pay for a certain tract of Land which I sold him that my Executor sell the Land to the best advantage that he can -
- 5th I will and devise that all my clothes be sold for cash and that my Executor sell all my other property of every every kind on a
