 Him, I give and bequeath unto my Brother John Callicott and
 my Sister Polly Dillion the sum of five Dollars Each and the
 More to be paid them by my Executors or Assigns herein
 after named whenever applied for - Him, I give and
 bequeath to my Brothers and Sisters herein after named viz,
 James Callicott, Asa Callicott Nancy Wife of George
 Tucker & Eliza Wife of Elijah Ashworth an Equal Right
 Interest and claim in Equal proportion to the three following
 Negroes viz, Ephraim, Peter and Abner by them to be
 Equally divided in such they and Moreover as they may
 think proper on the principle of honesty and fair dealing
 Still however insuring to my beloved wife Sally the use
 of the three last mentioned Negroes during her life or
 residence in this part of North Carolina or her Natural
 life and no longer - Him, and for the further explanation
 of those last mentioned Item My Will and desire is that
 my wife Sally shall have the use of them Peter and
 Ephraim while she lives in this part of the Country or during
 her Natural life but not intended to convey such rights as
 will give her the privilege to remove them to any other part
 of the United States or any other Government - Him, I do hereby
 appoint my beloved wife Sally and my Brother James
 Callicott Executors and Assigns to this my last Will and
 testament signed sealed and published and declared

In the Name of God Amen. I Samuel Johnson of Moore County being
 of sound and perfect Mind and Memory (blessed be God) to this last day of
 February in the year of our Lord 1827 Make and publish this my last Will
 and testament in Writing following that is to say. First I give and bequeath
 to my dear Wife Children viz, John Johnson, August Johnson, Daniel
 Johnson, Mary Johnson, Sarah Johnson, August Johnson, William
 Johnson, John Johnson Jr., William Johnson, and the heirs of Richard
 Johnson deceased Twenty percent of the Prob. and they are to enjoy the same of my
 property after my death, I give and bequeath to my five youngest
 Children viz, August Johnson, Christian Johnson, Marinda Johnson,
 Samuel Johnson & Mary Johnson by Wife all my Negroes slaves here to
 have, keep & use and household furniture farming utensils, household and
 Money, all my Lands Eighty fifty acres on the by property given to my son
 Samuel and being my wife during her lifetime and after her death that
 the property of said I bequeath, and if she should die my wife should
 after my death she is to have but the same as one of the youngest children
 and I hereby make and declare in my writing signed by me Samuel
 Johnson and John Ray Executor of this my last Will and testament
 published signed sealed and declared in the presence of us who were present at the time of signing and
 being there
