Residence in this part of the State of North Carolina and no longer
I give and bequeath unto my brother John Galliott and
my sister Polly Dillier the sum of five Dollars Each and No
More to be paid them by my Executrix or Successor herein
after named whenever applied for — Then, I give and
bequeath to my Brothers and Sisters herein after named, viz.,
James Galliott, Asa Galliott, Nancy wife of George
Lusk, Elbury wife of Elijah Ashworth and Equal Right
Intests and claims in Equal proportion to the three following
Negroes, viz., Ephraim, Peter and Abram by them to be
Equally divided in such way and Manner as they may
think proper on the principle of Honesty and fair dealing.
Still however owing to my beloved wife's death the care
of the three last mentioned Negroes during her stay or
residence in this part of North Carolina or her Natural
life and no longer — Then, and for the further explanation
of those last mentioned items My will and desire is that
My wife Sally shall have the use of Abram, Peter and
Ephraim while she lives in this part of the Country or during
her Natural life but not intended to convey such rights as
will give her the privilege to remove them to any other part
of the United States or any other Government or State, less truly
apposite my beloved wife Sally and my brother James
Galliott Executor and Successor to this my last will and
testament signed sealed and published and declared

Samuel Johnson's Will

In the Name of God. Amen. I Samuel Johnson of this County being
of sound and perfect Mind and memory thank be God, to this 1st day of
February in the year of our Lord 1817 make and publish this my last will
and testament in Moore following that is to say. First I give and bequeath
to my dear Childen, viz., John Johnson, Angus Johnson, Sarah
Johnson, Mary Johnson, Sarah Johnson, Margaret Johnson, William
Johnson, John Johnson, Asa Johnson, and the heirs of their bodies
Johnson forever jointly per se. And they will expect to receive my
property after my death. I give and bequeath to my young childen
childen, viz., John Johnson, Christian Johnson, Maria Johnson,
Samuel Johnson & Henry Johnson my wife at my death half to each
Hose, Sheep, C. and Land and furniture growing thereon. And to John and
Mary, all my Lands except fifty acres on the N. side of my property given to my son
Samuel and Mary my wife during her lifetime and after her death to
the property of said Samuel, and if the said John my wife arrives
after my death she is to have but the sum as one of the young childen
and Thirly acres and in my property, joint with Angus Johnson my
son, and John Ray Executor of this my last will and testament.
In witness whereof I have set the seal hereon this 1st day of February
in the year above written.
