Samuel Person's Will

In the name of God Amen I Sam^l Person of Moore County and
 State of N^c Carolina being of sound and perfect mind and memory
 Blessed be God do this nineteenth day of May in the year of our
 Lord one thousand Eight hundred and one make and publish
 this my last will and testament in manner following that is to
 say First of all I lend to my wife Tabitha - Sade and the
 Children she bears and also the plantation whereon I now live
 During her lifetime or widowhood also one bed and all the
 Household furniture the plantation tools two horses namely White
 and Silver three cows and calves her share of the stock and after
 her decease either by death or marriage I will that such above
 mentioned Land to be equally divided as can be ascertained
 by my Executors between my two sons Thos^d & Benjamin also
 one horse named Farlow to my son Thos^d also one black filly named
 Diamond to my son Benjamin also one cow and calf to
 each of my sons before mentioned Also I bequeath to my son
 William all that Part of Land on Fall Creek whereon I
 formerly lived that lies in Moore County and two Negroes by the
 name of Harry Tette and two cows and calves I also give and
 bequeath to my son Joseph John Person all the Land as I possess
 in Chatham County and two Negroes by name Will and
 Silvy also two cows and calves and one Colt apiece of the

my last mentioned sons the first that my mare poll brings to my
 son William and the next to my son Joseph John also I give and
 bequeath to my daughter Polly two negroes to wit James and Fells
 and one bed and furniture also one cow and calf I also give and
 bequeath to my two sons first mentioned Thomas and Benjamin
 one Negro a piece Sam I give to my son Thos^d and Phill I give to
 Benjamin I also give and bequeath to the Child my wife is supple
 to be with Childer with at this time one Negro Woman named Patsy
 and after the right agreeable to my will which I have sent to my
 wife of Negro Woman named Judith to her heirs also to the
 above mentioned Child I also give and bequeath to my two
 sons Thos^d and Benjamin Persons one Negro Woman named Delch
 when my son Thomas arrives to the age of sixteen years and at
 so from this time her increase if any and all the money in my
 house and all due by bonds Notes or otherwise and all my Wheat
 at full crock and tobacco now growing here to be turned
 into cash and out of that sum my debt to be paid and my
 tax for Eighteen hundred the Balance of the money to be let
 out upon Interest to be collect yearly such part as is neces
 ary for the schooling of my Children the other part of my mon
 ey still to continue upon Interest untill my son Thos^d
 comes to the age of twenty one years of age then to collect his
 part and as the other likewise all my hogs and all my sheep
 to be left for the use of my family my Black Smith tools
 and my Wagon also to be for the use of the plantation the
 profits arising from the Land on Fall Creek to pay the
 taxes yearly both of it and what I have given to my son
 Joseph John Person in Chatham the balance of the money
 still to be kept upon Interest untill they arrive twenty
 one years of age then the profits arising from both places
 by that on Fall Creek in Moore and that in Chatham County
 to be equally divided among them all the remainder of my
 estate to continue here for the use of the family untill
 the decease of my wife by death or by marriage and if
 any thing be made at my home plantation over and above
 the support of my family and stock the money to be put

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Out upon Interest until my Children comes of age lawfully
that is to say Thos. and Benjamin Polley and that which my
wife is supposed to be with child with at this time to be
equally divided among them the waggon & smith tools and
all other plantation tools at the desire of my wife to be sold
and the money Equally divided among all my children and
I hereby ordain my Friends Harrison Pison my wife David
Kennedy & Bryan Boraughs Executors of this my last will
and Testament Set my hand and Seal the day and year
above written.

sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thank

make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to
say principally and first of all I give and recommend my

again by the mighty power of God to be blessed in the
