I John Cole of Moore County and State of North Carolina do make and constitute this my Last Will and Testament first Marcellus & Elizabeth & my Daughter & having one brother Dead and furniture. Second to my son John Cole and Abraham Cole two hundred and fifty acres of Land, it being the same Land they now live on provided each of them pay to my son Harriet Cole twenty five Dollars the Land to Equally Divided - third Juilie and Elizabeth to my son Thomas Cole one hundred and Seventy acres of land including the plantation known as Lin on with all the Stock of Every Kind, Plantation tools and Household furniture And I appoint my son Abraham Cole Executor of this my last Will and Testament - in witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this third day July 1802  
one thousand eight hundred and two —

First give and bequeath to my Sister my Gray Meur  
Alice and my Husband to her and her Heirs for ever —

Also Give and bequeath to the rest of John Sellers Jr. Children  
(except John Sellers Jr.) all the rest of my personal property  
to be Equally divided among them and constitute aforesaid  
Orvin John Sellers Jr. my sole Executor to this my last Will

In the Name of God Amen I Duncan Williams of Moore  
County and State of North Carolina being in perfect Mind and  
Memory and knowing that it is Appointed for all men once to die  
do make constitute & ordain for my last Will and Testament making and  
annulling all other Wills & Testaments hitherto gone by me Made in the Year  
one thousand Eighty Six writing so make and ordain this my last Will and Now I do  
in witness following (viz) I desire to be Buried in a decent way  
in the ground from whence I came at the discretion of John Watson my  
desire is also that William Gilmer his son Duncan Gilmer shall have the  
Money in his Father's hands which is Thirty Dollars — My desire is also  
that the Minister who preaches my funeral shall two Dollars also  
Desire that John Watson shall have Eighteen Dollars that came  
out of my property Thirty Dollars had in his hands — Also desire
