In Witness whereof I the said John M. Neill have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal the 25th day of July 1816.

March the 23 day one thousand eight hundred and sixteen - I Thomas Coles of the County of Moore and State of North Carolina do make and Ordain this my last will and Testament - And first give and bequeath With Gray my son-in-law one Dollar to my son Andrew one Dollar to my son John if alive Twenty Dollars and to my son James Twenty Dollars to my son William Fifty Acres of Land lying on the East side of the New River Branch known by the Name of the Patience tract - After the above mentioned sum of money are raised out of my Estate the remainder of my Land Stock and Household furniture and all that is to say all my real and personal Estate I leave to my wife During her widowhood by her to be fully paid and enjoyed - and after her widowhood or death if she do not marry all my personal property shall be equally divided amongst her Children Also for the Land not mentioned before that tract between New River Slaves to my son George and that tract I bought of John Johnston to my son Thomas - And an other tract of fifty Acres joining that Tract between Slaves to my son Richard - And I appoint my wife and my son William to be my Executors - and I hereby disannul all other former wills legacies or bequests whatsoever Ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my last will and Testament in Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal day and year above written
