 A paper writing purporting to be last will and

 therefore by the Oath of A H McNeill proved  
 that B R Huske one of the Subscribing witnesses  
 thereto is dead and it is further proved by the  
 Oath and Examination of the said A H McNeill  
 that he is well acquainted with the handwriting  
 of the said B R Huske having often seen  
 him write and that the name of the said  
 B R Huske Subscribed as witness to the said will  
 is in the hand writing of the said B R Huske,  
 and further the due execution of said will by  
 the said Thos J Clegg having been proved by  
 the Oath and examination of E H Martin the  
 only Subscribing witness thereto.

It is then upon Consideration by the Court  
 that the said paper writing, and every part thereof  
 is the lost will and Testament of the said Thos J  
 Clegg and that the same is ordered to be recorded  
 will. And thereupon the said Thos J Clegg execu-  
 tor as aforesaid, duly qualified or such  
 by taking the Oath required by Law.

North Carolina Moore County

In the Name of God Amendt

I Thomas Fry being of sound mind and memory but  
 feeble of body and knowing that it is appointed  
 for man to die, do make and publish this to be my  
 last will and Testament (hereafter)

In the first place I will and desire that my  
 Executor hereinafter named shall collect all debts  
 that may be due to me at my death and pay  
 all debts which I shall justly be owing and also  
 my funeral expenses Secondly I will and desire after  
 paying said debts that my beloved wife have enherited  
 and possess all my estate both personal and real Estate  
 during her natural life to use the same said property  
 both real and personal as she may think fit during  
 her life time Thirdly I will and desire after the  
 death of my beloved wife should there be any of this my  
 said Estate left and remaining, that my grand  
 daughter Belinda Weddell shall inherit the same  
 both real and personal and I hereby give and bequeath  
 all my estate as aforesaid in this my last will and  
 I further will and desire that John McNeill shall  
 execute this my last will and do hereby nominate Con-  
 stitute and appoint him John McNeill my Executor  
 my Executor to this and hereby revoking all former  
 wills by me heretofore made published signed  
 sealed and delivered this 1<sup>st</sup> day of Sept 1861
