negro girls named Abba & Bess - Item 3rd I give
& devise unto my oldest daughter Elizabeth

Thomas two negro girls named Letty & Harish
Item 4th I give & devise unto my son W. D. Harrington
one negro boy by the name of Dan -

Item 5th I give and devise unto my son Lion
one negro boy by the name of Sam -

Item 6th I give and devise unto my son John
Harrington one negro boy by the name of
Nesley - Item 7th I give and devise unto my
son Thomas Harrington one negro boy
by the name of Ben & one girl named Jane -

Item 8th I give and devise unto my youngest
daughter Mary Arnold two negro girls named
Selin & Abba - Item 9th I give & devise unto my
youngest son Abner Harrington one
negro boy named Phoebe & a girl named

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Shel & also will that the balance of my slaves named M^{rs} Deane Adeline & Abigail be sold and the money be equally divided between my children that are not living with me that is James S. Harrington Elizabeth Thomas William Harrington Lion Harrington John Harrington and Mary Hendall -

I give & devise unto my two youngest sons Thomas Harrington & Abner F. Harrington all this tract of land on which I now live except the life Estate of my wife devised in a former will & after her death the whole to go unto my two sons Thomas & Abner F. Harrington also the two negroes left to my wife for and during her lifetime after her death to belong to my two youngest sons Thomas & Abner F. Harrington. I also give & devise unto my beloved wife Lydia & two youngest sons Thomas & Abner F. Harrington all my beads & furniture also all my household furniture also all my stock of horses mules cattle hogs sheep & poultry of all kinds my road wagon & all farming utensils. And lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my son Thomas my lawful Executor to all intents and purposing to execute this my last will and Testament according to the true intent and meaning of the same and every part and clause thereof hereby revoking and declaring utterly void all other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made -
