I William R Bergman of the County and State aforesaid being of sound and disposing mind and memory but knowing the uncertainty of my earthly existence do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament article first, first I will and bequeath that all my debts should be paid out of the first money coming into my Executive hands providing there be enough to do so but in case there shall not be enough arising from debts now due me my Executors shall dispose of my property that she may think best a most fit to make up the deficiency

Article second I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Eliza Jane all my property real and personal during her natural life

Article 3rd At the end of her life I give and bequeath all my real estate to my three Sons Mrs. Leuter John Walter William Rufus King Article 4th All the rest of my property I wish equally to be divided among my seven children Mrs. An. Eliza, Samuel, Louisa Francis, Mrs. Leuter Sarah, Mary, John Walter William Rufus King, I furthermore nominate and appoint my beloved wife Eliza Jane to be executrix of this my last will and testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal 5th day Oct^r, A D 1855
